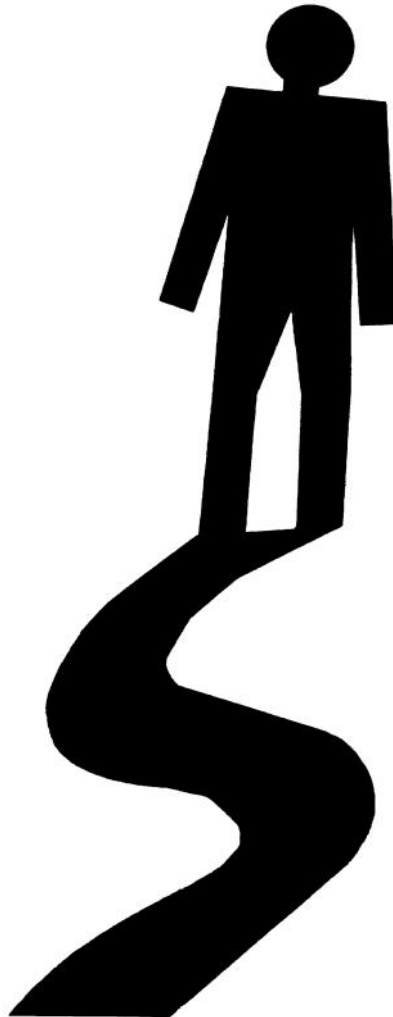

Chris Warner, son of Linda and Dick Warner, was diagnosed with MS in 2014. As a result of this diagnosis, Chris, who is an industrial painter by trade and a member of the local Painter's Union, worked until physical and safety concerns due to the advancement of the MS caused him to discontinue his trade and work



in retail on a limited basis. His neurosurgeon and doctors urged Chris to apply for Social Security Disability. Social Security denied benefits in July of 2017. As a result, Chris and his family were unable to meet monthly expenses forcing them to sell their home.

There will be a benefit for Chris and his family on October 20 from 4:00 to 8:00 pm at Mr. D's Bar & Grill at

5622 Grand Avenue. A Spaghetti Feed will be from 5:00 to 7:00 pm and costs \$10. There will also be a Silent Auction and Bar Olympics for raffle prizes. You do not need to be present to win.

Highlights — September 19, 2017 — 7:00 pm

Opening

Bonnie Schroeder-Palmi, Administrative Council facilitator, called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Pastor Cindy offered a prayer.

Steve reported that it has been a busy fall. The UMW and the men have met to discuss fundraisers. Conversations about reorganizing fundraisers will continue.

Treasurer's Report – Pat Anscomb

The August monthly summary was given. Balance on Hand, 8/31/17 is \$11,686.75. This September we paid \$3,880.26 in Apportionment payments, bringing our total to \$13,580.91 for our 2017 Apportionments so far this year.

Staff Parish Relations Committee – Cathy Sampson

The committee met on August 24th, and reviewed job descriptions. They have slightly changed the process of the annual staff reviews. Most of the staff reviews will be completed by October 15th. The next meeting will be on October 18th. Monday, October 23rd, is the date of our annual meeting with Susan Neinaber, our district superintendent.

Trustee's Report – Terry Olson

JP Trucking will be doing our plowing again this year. The parking lot has been resurfaced. Pasty money was used to pay for it. The fire department just completed an inspection that is done every three years. Some minor changes were made. The front door bids are starting to come in. We are assessing the roof to prepare for the winter months. The Trustees will help in the search for a new sound system.

United Methodist Women – Jan Akervik

We made 2,540 pasties last week. The UMW is working on a plan to divide up the labor and have more people involved in the planning process. Pantry, pies, donuts and meatball dinner are in October. The UMW Board met with the men's group to see how we can cut back on our fundraisers. Many good ideas came forth. The UMW is looking for help in the kitchen for funerals. An article in the Messenger will inform people how they can help. Pastor Cindy said she is looking into the possibility of having a funeral coordinator who could help families with funeral details.
