We Always Remain Connected

ne week ago today I stepped back onto the beautiful earth found here on the shores of Lake Superior. After a week of travel in England, I returned with a new sense of groundedness, joy, spaciousness and gratitude.

The journey began with a circle of 16 women sharing stories and intentions for our time together. Our backgrounds were diverse, our experiences varied and yet we shared a sense of curiosity and adventure.

As a part of our pilgrimage that week we visited many sacred sites and my favorite was Stonehenge. For years I have dreamed of being in the midst of these ancient stones, silently listening for the stories and the wisdom they have to share. When the time came and I walked into the circle of stones I cried tears of joy and deep gratitude.

We gathered in a circle, within the circle, for a sunset ceremony and just as we were ready to begin a raven flew up and landed on top of one of the stone pillars as a witness to our presence. The raven watched, and occasionally joined in, as we sang songs, said prayers and welcomed that precious moment between sunset and moonrise.

Our leader Mara invited us to find a place to sit or stand or walk in silence, opening our hearts to receive whatever the stones had to offer. I chose to sit by the same stone the raven had chosen. It was a powerful experience and as I look at and hold the pictures from that place, I remember.

The day after I returned to Duluth I went to my beloved Lake Superior, took off my shoes and again stood on the sacred, holy ground of the earth.

remembered how the poet David Whyte talks about God asking Moses through the burning bush to take off his shoes because he was standing on holy ground. Whyte believes that wherever and whenever we take off our shoes, we can be reminded that we too are standing on holy ground, the holy ground of our existence.

In my newsletter article last month I ended with these words: *I look forward to going and I look forward to returning, knowing we always remain connected.* I am beginning to better understand those words, "we always remain connected."

When I was away, the new church program year began. Thank you to all who helped to make it a meaningful time for our church. I am looking forward to the ministries and programs we have and will plan, which include:

- Sunday school for our children, adult studies for our grown ups AND this year confirmation for our youth.
- New members to our Praise Team and returning members to our adult and children's choirs.
- Many, many opportunities for outreach and community service.
- Fall pasties are behind us and donuts, pies, pantry and meatball dinner are right around the corner.
- And, a new church directory is being created that is filled with people who are beautiful from the inside out!

The Asbury UMC Finance Committee's responsibility is to manage and direct the financial affairs of the church and provide leadership for the Fall Financial Stewardship Drive. The committee meets quarterly to review the budget, both income and expenses, and more often in the fall during our stewardship drive. Often people wonder "where our money goes" so the Finance Com-

mittee has created this FYI (For Your Information about Money) to help keep you informed. If you have any questions, feel free to contact our Finance Chair Judi VanDell, or any other committee member.

This month's FYI \$

- With Fall just around the corner, the Finance Committee will begin shortly working on the Fall Finance stewardship Drive.
- September and October are great months to think about "catching up" your pledge if it fell behind over the summer months.
- Winter brings a few additional expenses with heating costs and snow plowing. Last year we spent \$1,413 in snow removal (\$3,000 budget for 2016) and our heating costs (budgeted under Water and Gas) were \$6,648 (\$6,000 budgeted for 2016). These expenses, of course, change based on the amount of that white stuff we get and the winter temperatures!

Opening:

Rob Karwath called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. For the opening prayer, Rob read today's *Upper Room* devotion entitled *Clouds of Blessing*.

Secretary's Report:

Minutes of the August 16, 2016, Administrative Council was reviewed. Jan Akervik made a motion to accept the minutes as written. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved. M - Jan Akervik, S - Sandy Winklesky

Lay Leader – Steve Kokotovich

A group has been organized to work on the Charlie Bell memorial through the Minnesota United Methodist Foundation. It was suggested that the committee have at least one female besides Pastor Cindy.

Treasurer's Report - Rob Karwath for Pat Anscomb

The revised report for March, Balance on Hand as of 7/31/16, is \$8,524.66. Balance on Hand, 8/31/16, is \$8,165.72.

As of 8/31/16, we have paid 11,663.52 of our 2016 Apportionments. This is 50% of the total owed.

Staff Parish Relations Committee Report

Ruth Thorpe mentioned that this committee and the Worship committee will be meeting on September 26th to plan a pastor appreciation event.

Trustees' Report - Terry Olson

The Boy Scouts have requested permission to build an 8' by 10' storage shed on the church property. It will cost \$1200 and will be funded and built by the Boy Scouts. The Trustees approved this project at their last meeting.

There is some damage to the driveway near the garbage cans. The Trustees have asked Northland Construction to help repair it.

The UMW has asked to have a small hot water heater installed in the Wesley Room. They will pay the cost of the heater.

An air conditioner will be installed in the Wesley Room in the Spring. A new \$350 security system has been installed at the church.

Rob will call to add our new website to our newspaper ad. Rally Day Sunday went very well and a big thank you goes out to all who helped.



- 14. Toiletries: toothbrushes, soap, toothpaste, lotion, shampoo and conditioner, Chapstick (especially for people living outside). Feminine hygiene products: unscented pads are most universally used, not tampons.
- 15. Spices like cinnamon, oregano, basil, salt, pepper.
- 16. Sliced bread. It's got a long shelf life but always goes immediately.
- 17. Bags of apples or potatoes.
- 18. Chocolate. It's not a necessity but a pick-me-up that most everyone would appreciate, especially when it comes time to fill stockings.
- 19. Consider donating reusable shopping bags. It takes a lot of humility for people to come to a food bank and since they'll likely be walking home or taking public transportation, it's nice to at least blend in.
