


Cíndy's Corner

The Asbury UMC Finance Committee's responsibility is to manage and direct the financial affairs of the church and provide leadership for the Fall Financial Stewardship Drive. The committee meets quarterly to review the budget, both income and expenses, and more often in the fall during our stewardship drive.

We have a total of \$118,290 pledged so far for our 2017 Operating Budget from 57 pledge units compared to \$112,668 pledged from 59 pledge units in 2016! If you have not returned your pledge card yet, please do so as soon as possible. There are cards available on the back table in the Narthex.

Opening

Rob Karwath called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm.

Secretary's Report:

Minutes of the September 20, 2016, Administrative Council was reviewed. Jan Akervik made a motion to accept the minutes as written. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved. **M – Jan Akervik**, **S – Cheryl Parendo**

Treasurer's Report/Finance - Pat Anscomb and Larry Scanlon

The September monthly summary was given. Balance on Hand, 9/30/16, is \$6,876.51.

The October monthly summary was given. Balance on hand, 10/31/16 is 9,599.41.

As of this date, we have made 9 payments of our 2016 Apportionments. We voted at the meeting to make 1 more payment this November, bringing our payment up to date so far this year. It is projected that we will be able to pay our Apportionments in total by the end of the year.

Balance Sheet: There is very little change in the Balance Sheet. We continue to be strong on the asset side with zero liabilities.

Trustees Report – Terry Olson

The driveway pavement has been fixed.

Terry will be installing the hot water heater in the Wesley Room himself. Other people have volunteered to help him. The total cost will be about \$250. This project will probably be done in January.

The elevator has been inspected and a few minor changes will be made.

The trustees will be putting up reflectors at the driveway entrances.

The UMW will fund new blacktop for the driveway next year.

The lights in the back of the church are on a timer. They have just been readjusted due to daylight savings time.

The Boy Scouts did not build a shed. They do have a cabinet that will be put in the Sunday School room in the basement.

Sandy Winklesky said the Sunday School needs more storage.

The room divider in the basement will be sold.

UMW Report - Jan Akervik

The pasty profits were \$7,616.92.

The meatball profits were \$3,637.40.

The Area UMW met and \$729 was collected to go toward mission work in Honduras.

The Advent Tea is on November 29th. UMW is setting its calendar and budget for 2017.

Layette Closet Now Only At Asbury UMC

The Layette Closet started in 1984 at Central Avenue UMC and came to Asbury UMC when Asbury was built and the churches merged. At one time, there were several other churches who also helped with this ministry. We are linked with the Salvation Army who distributes the layette bags through their social service program.

Times have changed and we are now the only church providing layette bags for new mothers in need. Each bag contains bottles, diapers, both pinning/ receiving blankets and a crib-size blanket, sleepers, onesies, booties, socks, bibs, hats and a snow suit for the winter or a sweater for the summer — bags are valued at approximately \$150-\$175 per layette.

If at any time you have a gently used item in size newborn to 18 months, please feel that you may bring that item to contribute. If you wish to make a monetary donation, please make checks to Asbury UMW or place your offering in the Sunday offering and mark it Layette Closet. All support is appreciated.
