sh Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent.
Lent is a time when many Christians prepare for Easter by observing a period of fasting, repentance, moderation and spiritual discipline.



Ash Wednesday emphasizes two themes: our sinfulness before God and our human mortality. The service focuses on both themes, helping us to realize that both have been triumphed through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

On Ash Wednesday, the use of ashes as a sign of mortality and repentance has a long history in Jewish and Christian worship. Historically, ashes signified purification and sorrow for sins. Knowing and experiencing God's forgiveness allows us to honestly examine our lives in preparation for the renewal and the resurrection of Easter.

The Asbury UMC Finance Committee's responsibility is to manage and direct the financial affairs of the church and provide leadership for the Fall Financial Stewardship Drive. The committee meets quarterly to review the budget, both income and expenses, and more often in the fall during our stewardship drive.

At the January Administrative Council Meeting, Pat Anscomb and Larry Scanlon presented the year-end financial information for 2016. At year-end we had all of our bills paid including our 2016 apportionments, and we went into 2017 with a balance on hand of \$7,608.62. This will come in handy because we had some mandatory elevator work done in January which will cost approximately \$2,000.

For 2017 our estimated income is up and we approved a solid budget for 2017. Copies of the budget are available in the church office. The Finance Team reported to Ad Council that overall our church is in a good financial position.


