

Minnesota Food Share March Campaign

During the entire month of March, all donations to CHUM's Emergency Food Shelf are proportionally matched by the Greater Minnesota Council of Churches. Asbury can help again this year with contributions of cash and/



or food. Cash donations are particularly helpful because of the food shelf's access to discount products and programs which can stretch donations further. Please make your check out to Asbury UMC if you want your donation to be included on your giving statement report.

The Minnesota FoodShare March Campaign brings together various Minnesota organizations, businesses, and places of worship to help keep 300 food shelves statewide stocked throughout the year. The March Campaign is the largest grassroots food and fund drive in the state, having raised \$8.2 million dollars and 5.2 million pounds of food in 2016, the most successful campaign in the organization's 34-year history.

This year, the CHUM churches are choosing a few specific items to donate (in addition to financial donations). Asbury has chosen peanut butter, mac & cheese, chili, stew and



cereal. You can bring the donations beginning March 1 through April 2.

March is the only month when every cash and food donation received by food shelves generates additional dollars from Minnesota Food Share. More information is at: mnfoodshare.org.



Committees . . . Councils . . . Work Areas? Have you ever wondered about the various committees/councils/work areas at Asbury UMC? Have you ever thought about how decisions are made and how you can be involved? If so, this is the column for you! In the next few months we will be highlighting various committees/councils/work areas explaining how they are organized and what they do. If you have questions, feel free to contact Steve Kokotovich, our Lay Leader or Pastor Cindy.

Administrative Council . . .

In the United Methodist Church, the purpose of the Church Council, or what we call the Administrative Council, is for planning and implementing programs of nurture, outreach, witness and resources in the local church. The Council also provides for the administration of the church's organization and temporal life. It envisions, plans, implements, and annually evaluates the mission and ministry of the church. Other responsibilities include reviewing the membership of the local church, establishing the annual budget on recommendation of the Committee on Finance and ensuring adequate provision for the financial needs of the church.

The council meets on the third Tuesday of most months at 7:00 pm. The Chairperson or the Pastor may call special meetings.

The membership of the council includes, but is not limited to, the following:

The Chairperson of the Administrative Council; the Lay Leader; chairpersons and/or representatives of the Staff-Parish Relations Committee, Committee on Finance, Board of Trustees, Outreach Committee, Membership Committee, Worship Committee, Christian Education Committee, Visitation Committee and Scholarship Committee; the church Treasurer; Lay Member to the MN Annual Conference; the President and/or a representative of the United Methodist Women; the Pastor; and at-large members.

The members present and voting at any duly announced meeting shall constitute a quorum. (From The Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church - 2016. Copyright 2016 by The United Methodist Publishing House. Used by permission.)

Recycling Refresher for 2017

Here is a list on what can be recycled:

- Plastic bottles and containers with a #1 through #7 on the bottom. Discard pumps.
- Glass bottles and jars. Clear, brown and green colors. Remove caps and lids. No broken glass.
- Metal tin and aluminum. Food, beverage and empty aerosol cans only.
- All items must be rinsed clean for recycling. Please flatten when practical.
- Newpaper. Includes all inserts.
- Magazine, catalogs, phone books.
- Envelopes, mail, office/computer paper
- Chipboard/paperboard like cereal boxes, etc.
- Corrugated cardboard. MUST be flattened and no larger than 2 ft. x 2 ft. pieces.

These items **cannot** be recycled: plastic bags, plastic cups, cat litter pails, styrofoam, packing peanuts, light bulbs, mirrors, window glass, ceramics, ovenware,

dishes, drinking glasses, scrap metal, hangers, oil/ antifreeze containers, pizza boxes, paper milk cartons and scrap wood.
