

With our eyes still heavy with sleep, we walk through a garden of sculptures and down some very steep, uneven steps to a flat rock cliff below. There we stand shoulder to shoulder as the waves splash up against the rock sending a mist of water over us, gently touching our skin with grace.

With great anticipation, we witness the very first light of day. This year my new friend Carol raised a conch shell to her lips and blew loud and fierce. We watched as the sun made its way up the morning sky with the promise of a new day. It was a holy moment for me.

In a few short weeks Easter will arrive with a first ray of sunlight announcing the resurrection of Jesus and proclaiming that suffering and death will not have the last word. Easter's message is one of grace and joy and hope in the face of emptiness and grief. Easter invites us to open our hearts to God's great gift of a new day and deep, deep abiding presence and love! Dear Pastor Rasmussen and Asbury United Methodist Church:

Thanks to your support we rescued and distributed a record 5.5 million pounds of food or enough food for 4.4 million meals in 2016. Your help and ontribution of 33 hours of volunteer service in 2016 resulted in meals for over 44,000 NE Minnesota and NW Wisconsin residents in need. In 2016 nearly 1,200 regional volunteers contributed 12,780 hours of volunteer service — the equivalent of over six full-time positions and an estimated savings of \$172,000 in staff expense. Your contribution to our work ensured children in our BackPack Program received weekend meals, families at our food shelf and Mobile Food Pantry Programs had enough food for every meal and seniors receiving our monthly food boxes didn't have to choose between heat or food. We thank you for your ongoing commitment to assist our Northland neighbors in need.

Committees . . . Councils . . . Work Areas?

ave you ever wondered about the various **L** committees/councils/work areas at Asbury UMC? Have you ever thought about how decisions are made and how you can be involved? If so, this is the column for you! In the next few months we will be highlighting various committees/councils/work areas explaining how they are organized and what they do. If you have questions, feel free to contact Steve Kokotovich, our Lay Leader or Pastor Cindy.

Staff Parish Relations . . .

aragraph 258.2 of the United Methodist Discipline states: There shall be elected annually by the charge conference in each local church a committee on pastor-parish relations or staff-parish relations who are professing members of the local church or charge or associate members. The committee shall be composed of not fewer than five nor more than 9 persons representative of the total charge. It shall assist the pastor(s) and staff in assessing their gifts. maintaining health holistically and work-life balance, and setting priorities for leadership and service.

Some of the committees' responsibilities are listed below:

- To encourage, strengthen, nurture, support, and respect the pastor(s) and staff and their family(s).
- To promote unity in the church and address any concerns/conflicts between staff members and the congregation. This committee addresses any concerns raised by the congregation regarding staff members.
- To confer with and counsel the pastor(s) and staff on the matters pertaining to the effectiveness of ministry; relationships with the congregation; and to interpret the nature and function of the ministry.
- To provide evaluation at least annually for the use of the pastor(s) and staff in an ongoing effective ministry and for identifying continuing educational needs and plans.
- To communicate and interpret to the congregation the nature and function of ministry in The United Methodist Church regarding open itinerancy. The committee shall work with the district superintendent and the bishop in securing clergy

- leadership. Its relationship to the district superintendent and the bishop shall be advisory only. (See ¶¶ 425-428.)
- To develop and approve written job descriptions and titles for associate pastors and other staff members in cooperation with the senior pastor.
- To consult on matters pertaining to pulpit supply, proposals for compensation, travel expense, vacation, health and life insurance, pension, housing in compliance with the policy of the annual conference), and other practical matters affecting the work and families of the pastor and staff, and to make annual recommendations regarding such matters to the church council, reporting budget items to the committee on finance.
- To encourage, monitor, and support clergy and lay staff pursuit of health and wholeness.
