

Financial Stewardship Drive. The committee meets quarterly to review the budget, both income and expenses, and more often in the fall during our stewardship drive. The Finance Committee is happy to share information from our recent Stewardship Drive. We have received pledges from 62 giving units for a total of \$126,656. This compares with 67 pledges from last year for a total of

\$132,438. As the numbers show, we are slightly under last year's totals. A huge thank you to everyone for making the campaign a success this year. A gentle reminder to those of you who intend to pledge but haven't yet turned in your card, please do so as soon as possible as the Finance Committee will be working to finalize the 2018 budget soon. Other good news — we anticipate being able to pay 100% of our Apportionments this year.
