<u>Cíndy's Corner</u>

calendar this past Sunday, which immediately follows Pentecost, is known as Trinity Sunday. The traditional Trinitarian formula describes God as three in One – Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Another describes God as three in one one shaped by the way God acts –Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer.

Frederick Buechner in his book Wishful Thinking adds another description: "The much-maligned doctrine of the Trinity is an assertion that, appearances to the contrary notwithstanding, there is only one God. Father, Son and Holy Spirit means that the mystery beyond us, the mystery among us and the mystery within us are all the same mystery."

For me, the doctrine of the Trinity suggests connectedness and integration. And more importantly, I believe the Trinity reveals to us that relationships stand at the heart of God and the Universe. Relationships that create and recreate, that redeem and save us in so many ways, and that sustain and ground us in the love and grace and peace that good, solid, loving relationships can provide.

On Sunday morning I woke up to the loud foghorns blaring on Park Point. I looked out of my window and I couldn't see anything beyond the grass right in front of my balcony. As I sat in my rocking chair for my morning quiet/devotion time I thought about the many different times in life we can feel as if we are surrounded by fog. It could be because of the death of a loved one, an illness, a strained or broken relationship or other real-life challenges.

As I sat quietly, I reflected on the many ways we seek to make our way through those times of fog. Like the foghorns, sometimes

we make a lot of noise about it, which isn't always helpful but occasionally necessary. Often we use navigation



tools provided by a helpful book, or guidance from others or wisdom learned from previous experiences. Making our way also includes times of stopping and resting and believing that the fog will eventually lift.

I think another navigation tool, and probably the most important is connecting to our own inner intuition and strength provided by the Holy Spirit, the mystery within. Listening for the still small voice that reminds us that we are never alone.

If we accept the assertion that relationships stand at the heart of God and the Universe, getting through the fog will mean being in relationship. It all begins in our relationship with God; God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit; God as Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer; God as mystery beyond us, among us and within us.

Next is our relationship with ourselves. I think we all know that to be in healthy relationships with others we first have to really know and love and care for ourselves. Unfortunately, even though we know it, we do not always live by it. I am reminded of the instructions from flight attendants when we fly, "in case of an emergency and the oxygen masks drop down, put on your mask before you help others." When we can care for and truly love ourselves is when we can share that by loving others.

Ad Council Meeting Highlights — 5-15-18

Opening

Steve Kokotovich called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Pastor Cindy provided the opening prayer.

Secretary's Report:

Minutes of the March 20, 2018, Administrative Council were reviewed. Sandy Winklesky made a motion to accept the minutes as read. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.

Lay Leader's Report - Steve Kokotovich

Steve Kokotovich will be attending Annual Conference along with Pastor Cindy. The Conference begins May 30th.

Treasurer's Report - Pat Anscomb

The April monthly summary was given. Balance on Hand, 4 /30/18 is \$33,282.83. This amount includes money collected for the roof repair. In the beginning of May, 3 payments were made on our 2018 Apportionments. On behalf of the Finance/Stewardship Committee and The Board of Trustees, Pastor Cindy presented and explained a proposal to fund the roof repair that was approved at a combined meeting of the two committees on April 17, 2018 (See FYI\$ on page 6 of this Newsletter for more information). On behalf of the Committees, Pat Anscomb moved that we approve the proposal and Ruth Thorpe seconded. The Ad Council discussed the motion and an amendment was made. The Ad Council voted on the amended motion:

To use the leftover MNDOT Land Sale Proceeds of \$2,797 along with the \$3,374 of the remaining Bethany Funds combined with a sale of ALLETE stock in the amount \$10,000 with 60% from the Schwar Fund and 40% from the Asbury Fund, in addition to the money raised by the congregation and matched by UMW (\$10,000) to pay for the necessary roof repairs. Motion unanimously approved by the Administrative Council.

Staff Parish Relations Committee - Cathy Sampson

Members of the committee met with the church custodian to review his job description.

Ruby Slennes, our choir director, will be retiring on May 20^{th} . This summer the committee will meet with current and former members of the choir to decide how to move forward with this position.

Trustee's Report - no report

\$2,046.75 was made at the April 28th, rummage sale.

The Area UMW met at First United Methodist Church. \$483 was collected to go to UMW Missions.

Preparing for the donut sale is on Thursday, June 7th, and making and selling the donuts is on Friday, June 8th.

The church is still having difficulty obtaining bids for new church entrance doors. The UMW has money set aside for this project.

The committee has completed their work and presented three proposals to the Bishops: 1) Traditionalist Plan, 2) One Church Plan, and 3) Connectional Conference Plan. The proposals have been reviewed by the Bishops and they have recommended the "One Church Plan." The final decision will be made at the special 2019 General Conference. he Asbury UMC Finance Committee's responsibility is to manage and direct the financial affairs of the church and provide leadership for the Fall Financial Stewardship Campaign. Recently they, along with the members of the Board of Trustees, met to explore options for funding the repair of the two flat roofs at the front of the church. This is the process and the decisions that were made:

A combined meeting of the Finance/Stewardship Committee and the Board of Trustees was held on April 17, 2018, to explore options and recommend a plan to fund the upcoming roof repair. The two committees celebrated the generous financial response from the congregation of \$15,180 and UMW matching funds of \$10,000.

They then explored various ways of funding the remaining amount for the roof repair including using unspent available funds (remaining MN Dot Sale proceeds, money from the merger with Bethany UMC and a Capital Improvement Emergency Fund), obtaining a loan and using a small portion of our ALLETE stock assets. Of these options, the Committees felt it is necessary to keep the Capital Improvement Emergency Fund because it is money given by the congregation through a previous fundraiser for a specific need and also thought obtaining a loan would not be in the church's best interest.

The Committee discussed the possibility of selling 135 shares (approximately \$10,000) of our ALLETE stock, which would be less than 4% of the total number of shares we own. The number of shares to sell from each of our two ALLETE stock accounts was determined by the total number of shares held and the percentage of that total in each separate fund (40% in the Asbury Fund and 60% in the Schwar Fund).

After much thoughtful discussion and consideration, the following motion was made and approved by the combined committees: To use the leftover MNDOT Land Sale Proceeds of \$2,797 along with the \$3,374 of the remaining Bethany Funds combined with a sale of 135 shares of ALLETE Stock (81 shares from the Schwar Fund and 54 from the Asbury Fund) in addition to the money raised by the congregation and matched by UMW (\$10,000) to pay for the necessary roof repairs.

At the Ad Council meeting on May 15, 2018, Pat Anscomb, on behalf of the Finance and Trustees, moved that we approve this proposal and Ruth Thorpe seconded. The Ad Council discussed this motion and because of the changing value of the stock, Cathy Sampson made a motion for an amendment changing the exact number of ALLETE stock sold: a sale of ALLETE stock in the amount \$10,000 with 60% from the Schwar Fund and 40% from the Asbury Fund. Carrie Sutherland seconded the amendment and it was approved.

The amended motion was then presented: To use the leftover MNDOT Land Sale Proceeds of \$2,797 along with the \$3,374 of the remaining Bethany Funds combined with a sale of ALLETE stock in the amount \$10,000 with 60% from the Schwar Fund and 40% from the Asbury Fund, in addition to the money raised by the congregation and matched by UMW (\$10,000) to pay for the necessary roof repairs.

This motion was unanimously approved by the Administrative Council.
