7:00 pm. This event is sponsored by the Outreach Committee and is a great opportunity for visiting with friends from the church and also meeting neighbors.




On August 5, after worship we would appreciate help distributing the door hanger invitations for the picnic.

ere it is the end of July already! Time flies by in the summer, which always reminds me of the importance of enjoying each day. The warmth of the sun in the daylight, the glow of the moon and stars at night and everything in between! Each day I try to remember to give thanks for the beauty and goodness of creation and the many experiences and people who bring us joy and happiness.
