<u>Cíndy's Corner</u>

was at church working in my office when my cell phone rang. I answered it and a recorded voice said, "we have been trying to reach you regarding your car warranty." I hung up. Usually I look at the number before answering and I know this number well because they call at least every other day. A couple hours later my phone rang again. I looked at the number and saw the same area code, 763. I answered the phone and said, in kind of a loud voice, "take me off your calling list!" Then I hung up.

A few minutes later my phone rang AGAIN with the same area code but I looked closer and it was a different number. I decided to answer this time and it was my friend Diane. She said, "the weirdest thing just happened, I thought I called your number but I got this voice yelling 'Take me off your calling list!" Oh boy! Thank goodness I inherited my Mother's great sense of humor and we had a good, long laugh about it!

In my conversation with Diane we both lamented the fact that in a few days it will be December 1st. Even though our days are full and often seem long, the weeks and months and years can seem to fly by. As we turn the calendar to December, we in the Christian Church begin the season of Advent, the season of waiting and watching and anticipation. The Advent season invites us to slow down and breath, as the culture around us seduces us to get lost in the hustle and bustle of the secular events and experiences.

During Advent, we are invited to soak in silence whenever we have the opportunity, whenever we become aware that we need it. So this year, when our schedules feel unmanageable, our tasks seem overwhelming and the noise of the season invades the silence, perhaps we can create some space for simplicity, quiet and presence offered and received. Perhaps we can slow down and look



for the God moments in the simplicity of each day, and practice gratitude for all that is and will be as we prepare to celebrate once again Emmanuel God-with-us.

I close with a poem by Tina Datsko de Sánchez who serves as Poet in Residence at the First Congregational Church of Long Beach.

In this hectic season help us to remember, even the simplest actions count.

Let us pause and take a breath to feel the miracle of air filling and emptying within, as though God is breathing into us.

Let our eyes really see.
How does sunlight glow on tree leaves?
How do stars glimmer in the night sky?
Help us pay attention.
What does an apple really taste like?

Let us walk outdoors and feel the air moving, see clouds shifting or shimmering at sunset. Help us shake hands or embrace and feel the warmth of another human being.

Let us look a person in the eyes and discover the sparkle of a fellow soul. May we give and receive kindness, for that is where God lives.

Ad Council Meeting Minutes — 11-27-18

Opening

Steve Kokotovich called the meeting to order at 7:15 p.m.

Secretary's Report:

Minutes of the October 16, 2018, Administrative Council were reviewed. Jan Akervik made a motion to accept the minutes as read. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved. **M – Jan Akervik, S – Cheryl Parendo**

Lay Leader's Report - Steve Kokotovich

Steve stated that fall has been a busy time for us, including Pastor Cindy. As we move into Advent Season, though we are very fortunate to have so many events happening, we need to be mindful not to over extend ourselves and our pastor.

Treasurer's Report/Finance - Pat Anscomb

The October monthly summary was given. Balance on Hand, 10/31/18 is \$16,432.08.

As of 10/31/18, we have paid \$11,516.10 of our 2018 Apportionments with a balance due of \$11,515.90. This is 50% of our 2018 Apportionments. Pat mentioned that in November, 4 more monthly payments have been made, with only 2 payments left to complete the year.

The Finance Committee is working on the 2019 budget. So far, we have 52 units pledged with a total of \$95,336.

Staff Parish Relations Committee - Cathy Sampson

Cathy has been busy collecting information to create a church profile that lists our common values and goals. This will be helpful in the appointment process for our new minister. From the information that she has collected, she will present a summary draft to the SPPRC meeting tomorrow.

Trustee's Report – Terry Olson

The Trustees are creating a list of long and short term projects and maintenance needs of the church.

United Methodist Women - Jan Akervik

The Pantry has made over \$6,000 to date.

The UMW Board is developing their 2019 budget.

The kitchen has been cleaned and the UMW is very pleased with the work done. A lower bid has come in, so we will try that cleaner for next Spring. The UMW will then make a decision on which cleaner they will choose for future cleanings.

Faith Circle has decided to discontinue the layette project due to lack of need. Leftover layette items have been distributed to area agencies that serve young children.

The UMW will continue to serve children and families through donations raised at the annual Advent Tea.

We will be having a Spring rummage sale on April 27th.

Outreach and Missions Team - Steve Kokotovich

We will be serving at the Damiano Center on December 1st. Asbury is participating in the Salvation Army Toy Drive.

Education Team - Cheryl Parendo and Sandy Winklesky

The Sunday School is having great attendance.

Adult Education opportunities will be offered in January using FaithLink and also a class on writing an obituary and planning a funeral/memorial service. There will also be a Lenten study.

Trustees remind us that we need to remember to keep the second doors to the church entrance closed in the cooler months as well as the doors to classroom and meeting rooms. This will help cut down on our church heating costs.


