# **God Is Walking With Us!**

appy Easter Asbury family. Let me share the traditional greeting with you: Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Though Easter Sunday is past, we still celebrate the season of Easter — where we remember Jesus is alive and join him in everlasting life.

And yet, let me say what might be obvious to everyone; this Easter season is hard. We are doing hard things. Whether you are having to work from home, work somewhere as an essential employee, teach your children challenging math, feeling lonely, or perhaps even enjoying a slower pace, this is still hard.

Alongside this challenge, our grief is real. There are so many reasons for grief. At the beginning of the shelter in place orders, Brian conducted an online funeral – not just for people who have died, but for expectations, dreams, jobs, ways of life, end of year celebrations, family gatherings, and graduations. All these things and so many more have been canceled or postponed. And it's okay to grieve going through all the different stages – denial, anger, bargaining, depression, acceptance – back and forth and around again.

I'm thankful for the gift of Easter, in that Jesus never made light of anyone's grief. He couldn't just die, then pop back like a Jack-In-the-Box and expect everyone to be okay. There was a three-day wait as well as ongoing adjustment because the disciples' grief was real.

Love is also real. You are dearly loved. Remember that God loves you and there is a community around you, though physically distant right now, who is embracing you. Not everyone saw Jesus



at the same time, or in the same way. But Jesus' return was the mark of God's enduring love and that Jesus wanted to be with his family - the disciples.

Which brings us to Pentecost and the Holy Spirit. Fifty days after the resurrection, the disciples were gathered together in an upper room. The Holy Spirit came upon them like tongues of fire and they went out sharing the good news of God's love for all people. Many were gathered that day and many were added to the number of believers. Now, though we cannot gather together as we might like, the same Holy Spirit brings us together again with the good news of God's love for all people.

So we are living in times of great challenge, but with a God of great promise who is walking with us!

#### **Information on Katerin**

We received the following update from Compassion International on our sponsored child, Katerin.

#### Dear Friends,

You may be wondering how Katerin is doing? Here is the latest update from El Salvador to give you a glimpse into the life of Katerin and give you assurance that Compassion International's partner churches around the world continue to serve and love your child.

There are currently active cases of coronavirus in El Salvador. The country issued a mandatory nationwide quarantine. All educational activities are suspended, and Compassion programming is on hold. Partner churches are supporting the most vulnerable families with food and available medicine. Partner churches are also developing tutoring materials online so children can continue learning from home.

You may notice a lack of letters in the coming months, as children will not be at the Compassion centers to write or send their letters. Please rest assured that our staff in El Salvador is working hard to provide support wherever possible. While the program activities cannot happen in groups at the churches, staff will continue to keep in touch with the children and attend to health issues as they are able. The main goal during the program suspension is to keep the children safe and protected.

May these updates give you powerful ways to pray for your sponsored child and the people of her country. Thank you for caring, for praying and for sharing. We know this is a difficult time for everyone.

### Ad Council Meeting Minutes — 4-28-20

#### Opening

In Bonnie Schroeder-Palmi's absence, Steve Kokotovich called the meeting to order at 6:38 p.m. Due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, the Administrative Council used the Bluejeans communications app to virtually meet. Steve mentioned that we have a very full agenda for this meeting. Pastor Katherine offered a prayer asking God to help us be together in spirit to navigate through these difficult and different times.

#### Secretary's Report:

Minutes of the February 18, 2020, Administrative Council were reviewed. Cathy Sampson made a motion to accept the minutes as read. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved. **M – Cathy Sampson, S – Pat Anscomb** 

#### Lay Leader's Report - Steve Kokotovich - no report

#### Treasurer's Report - Pat Anscomb

The February monthly summary was given. Balance on Hand, 2 /29/20 is \$1,676.86. The March monthly summary was given. Balance on Hand, 3/31/20 is -\$37.05. We have not paid any of our 2020 Conference Apportionments so far this year.

Pat presented the Three Month Income Statement prepared by Larry Scanlon. Pledges and other envelope giving held up well, which is good because of an over expenditure in the elevator maintenance. Once again, church members are encouraged to keep up their pledges.

Pat also presented the Balance Sheet prepared by Larry Scanlon. The church has strong asset holdings and no liabilities.

Steve Kokotovich gave us an update on the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan. Asbury's application was not in the first round of loans given by the federal government, and we are still waiting to hear if our application was accepted for the second round of granted loans.

The United Methodist Foundation is now being managed by Wespath, a subsidiary of UMC.

The Minnesota Conference has provided a waiver to the budget so that Asbury's share to Pastor Katherine's health insurance and retirement will not be billed for 3 months. She still receives the benefits.

#### Staff Parish Relations Committee - Cathy Sampson

Due to COVID-19, the committee has not met lately. Cathy mentioned that all staff are being paid. Shirley's usual work, plus more, continues. Dan is working on a worklist provided by the church and he gives us weekly updates. And Phyllis is contributing music to the weekly, online Sunday services. Pastor Katherine is communicating with them.

#### Trustee's Report - no report

#### United Methodist Women - Jan Akervik

Carpeting has all been cleaned in the basement, narthex, sanctuary, Wesley Room and the two church offices.

Due to COVID-19, the donut sale, meatball dinner, rummage sale and diaper drive have all been postponed.

Monthly cards continue to be mailed out.

The Green Door Book Club will meet in the lower parking lot on Monday, May  $4^{th}$ , at 10:00 a.m. Social distancing will be observed.

#### Outreach and Missions Team - Steve Kokotovich

Neither the Damiano Center or the Second Harvest are asking for church volunteers at this time.

For the CHUM March Food Drive, Asbury donated \$1,648.85 and 83 pounds of food. Since this collection is ongoing until the end of May, cash donations can be marked for CHUM and mailed to the church. A date will be set when a cardboard box will be set outside the church door for people to drop off food donations. This date will be mentioned in the *Messenger*.

#### Education Team - Sandy Winklesky

The Sunday School has not been meeting and the Education Team's meeting set for tomorrow night has been cancelled.

Pastor Katherine applied for, and received, a High School Summer Ministry Internship Grant for \$500. Pastor Katherine has written an invitation for high school students to apply for this grant which will be for 50 hours of work.

#### Worship Team - Debbie Merrick

Debbie has sent communications out to the team and they will meet virtually in May. The Worship Team plans to compensate Pastor Katherine's son, Michael, for all of his technical work in putting the Sunday services online.

A streaming license for CCLI music services has been purchased for one year at a cost of approximately \$60. There will be a process of clarifying who will be on the Worship Team and what their roles will be. The team will be working on ways to be creative with music participation.

#### Nurture/Congregational Care Team - Sandy Winklesky

The Visitation Committee has been making sure that those they usually visit are being connected with cards and phone calls.

The Scholarship Committee reported that two people have applied for the scholarships and they will be awarded during the May 17th Sunday service.

The Membership Committee reported that they have been connecting with the Visitation Team to make sure that the church is staying connected with members.

#### Pastor's Report - Katherine Cornell

Pastor Katherine thanked all of us walking this difficult and challenging path together. It is time to think about the process of getting back to services at the church. To prepare for tonight's meeting, Pastor Katherine emailed a link containing 24 things to consider before reopening the church. She would like to form a group to plan this process.

#### Old Business - none

#### New Business - Steve Kokotovich

It was decided that we use the \$680 from the Easter offering in house this year. Jan Akervik made a motion that the money will be used for the Worship Team to purchase the \$60 music streaming service and other technological expenses for having our worship services online. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.

### M – Jan Akervik, S – Cathy Sampson.

Pastor Katherine has applied for a Dare to Reach Grant for \$1000. She and Stephanie Peterson have been doing technology research so we can continue streaming our services every Sunday. Pastor Katherine would like others to join that team. Asbury is organizing an assistance fund to help people during this difficult time. Pastor Katherine is including an article in the coming *Messenger* to promote this. Members who want to give can donate money or food and gas gift cards.

We discussed the benefits of purchasing a \$150 Zoom video conference program. This program would allow us to have our own control on video conferences and we discussed the possible uses by several committee of the church.

A technical team is being organized as a subset of the Worship Committee. Pastor Katherine, Stephanie Peterson and Debbie Merrick will be on this committee. Pastor Katherine will arrange to have an email go out to invite others to join this team. She will also place an invitation article in the June *Messenger*.

Pastor Katherine is forming a committee to make plans for returning to in-person church worship. It was agreed that this process will be done in a thoughtful, gradual manner. The committee will formulate a proposal and present it at the next Ad. Council meeting. Jan, Debbie, Steve and Cathy have agreed to be on this committee. Ad. Council members are encouraged to read the article, 24 Questions Your Church Should Answer Before People Return by Ken Brady. She would like us to provide feedback about the article by May 5th.

It was decided that a "Donate Now" button will be included on our web page.

#### Closing

The next Ad. Council virtual meeting will be on Tuesday, May 19th. Jan Akervik made a motion to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.




