Asbury UMC Sanctuary Worship Guidelines for COVID-19 Re-opening Plan

1. Please enter through the main front doors ONLY for Sunday Worship Services. The downstairs door will be locked. Plan to come a few minutes earlier than usual.
2. There will be NO coffee time BEFORE or AFTER the service until further notice.
3. We are requiring masks to be worn while in the building. **Please bring your own** and put it on before entering.
4. Social distancing markers will be in place at the entrance. Each household group is asked to wait at the respective marker until the next position is free.
5. Entering the Narthex, you will come to a table. Please use hand sanitizer first.
6. Attendees entering the building will be asked to sign in on the tracing sheet. You may use a pencil from those available and then drop the used pencil into the basket provided to be cleansed. This

Reflections on Freedom

Every July we celebrate the independence of our country from foreign and oppressive rule. We celebrate that we as American citizens are free to worship as we please, and to govern ourselves. This year, as we celebrate, I think it's important to recognize a few things.

There are many ways a person can be bound, chained, oppressed — while the celebration of independence is important — not everyone is as free as their neighbor. Some bonds of oppression involve choices that people have made, and many others are bonds that were inherited or a choice another person made for them. Some are a mixture of the two. These bonds include poverty, addiction, mental illness, citizenship status, and racism. So the question of freedom becomes who is truly free and how do we work towards freedom for those that are oppressed?

One might ask why does it matter? Well, I hope the answer is obvious for all followers of Jesus. Jesus said he came to “proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free” (*Luke 4:18*).

So the question remains as followers of Jesus, how are we are to be the instruments of God's love in this world? Jesus said to love as he loved and to be active in healing and setting people free from oppression.

Are we learning how to be anti-racists? Are we advocates for mental health? Are we investing in places of generational poverty to help break that cycle? Are we examining our own habits to



see where we inadvertently created a system needing illegal immigrants to work so our groceries are affordable? Where is Jesus calling you to be involved in his great movement towards freedom?

Finally, we know that in all things, our independence is not true independence, but the chance to declare ourselves fully dependent on God. Jesus came so we all might have life and have it abundantly (*John 10:10*). As we grow in our dependence on God, we can grow in our work towards abundant life for us and for our neighbor.

This year, as we celebrate independence on the Fourth of July, may we also take some time to reflect and then take action towards loosening the bonds of oppression we see around us.

information is only to be used if COVID-19 illness occurs and notification and contact tracing is needed.

7. Bulletins will be available. Please only handle your own bulletin. Feel free to take it home or to drop it in the recycle bin as you exit.
8. Offerings may be placed in the collection plates on your way to your seat or as you exit. Please don't linger in order to maintain the flow while entering and exiting.
9. Please maintain a 6-foot distance from everyone not in your household at all times throughout the service.
10. It is recommended you avoid shaking hands, hugging, fist bumps, or personal contact in order to protect all.
11. You will be directed to fill the front pews first keeping 6 feet between individuals not from your household. Six-foot markings are on the pew cushions. Please use these to maintain proper distances as you fill the pews. Every other pew will remain empty and is taped off.
12. There will be NO SINGING during worship until further notice. Please keep masks on throughout the service including during group prayers.
13. When the service ends, please remain seated until Pastor Katherine dismisses your row. As you exit, please maintain a 6-foot distance between you and others and make space outside the door for others to come through. You may have outdoor conversation away from the entrance with safe social distancing practices.
14. As a reminder, it is recommended to avoid touching your face and to wash your hands often.
15. If you use the bathroom during the service, please wipe down each surface you touch including handles and light switches with a cleaning wipe before leaving the bathroom.

Thank you for your attention and compliance with these measures to keep us all protected and healthy.



Guidelines For Small Group Gatherings At Asbury United Methodist Church

As Asbury UMC moves through phases to reopening our church and welcoming individuals and groups back into the church building, here are the guidelines we would ask all groups to follow.

- All group participants need to sign in to facilitate possible contact tracing if needed.
- Practice physical distancing in all situations remaining 6 feet apart.
- Limit group size, ideally to 10 or less with an absolute maximum of 12.
- Wear face masks as participants arrive and leave, at a minimum. Ideally, face masks will be worn for the entire time. (We do understand that you cannot drink or eat with a face mask and during yoga practice or bone builders, a face mask may prohibit necessary breath activity. However, expelling breath with exaggerated force at this time may not be wise.)
- Participants are encouraged to bring their own beverages and/or food.
- Use hand sanitizer upon arriving (provided).

If anyone in the group is experiencing the following symptoms or has had these experiences, they should not participate in group or leave immediately.


- Have a fever, cough, shortness of breath, muscle aches, chills, sore throat, loss of taste or smell, headache, or generally aren't feeling well for any reason.
- Have traveled by plane in the past 14 days.
- Are currently awaiting the results from a COVID-19 test.
- Have been exposed to or live with someone who has symptoms or has tested positive for COVID-19.
- If someone develops symptoms of COVID-19 within two weeks of participating in a group at Asbury UMC regardless of the suspected source, please contact the church – 218-624-0061 – immediately so that risk exposure can be assessed and the MN Department of Health can be contacted.

Thank you for respecting and following these guidelines so that we can all stay safe and well.

The last few weeks have been a time of uncertainty and anxiety for everyone. But here at CHUM we have been overwhelmed — in the best way possible — by the incredible support from this community.

Donations have been steady, constant, and extremely generous. So many of you have sent in checks, or made an online donation, without being asked — because you know that the people we serve need us now more than ever.

- Scissors

- Glue
- Pipe cleaner (3 inches)

What you do:

1. Fold the square corner to corner to form an X. Unfold.
2. To make spokes, cut the four creases until an inch from the center.
3. Punch a hole in the middle of the square, near the tips of each spoke, and in the middle of each circle.
4. Fold each spoke toward the center, lining up the holes. Glue in place.
5. Wrap one end of the pipe cleaner around the top of the straw. Thread a circle, the pinwheel, and the remaining circle onto the pipe cleaner.
6. Roll the pipe cleaner end into a ball. Then spin!
