hen I was young, I LOVED the start of a new school year. It was a new, unmarked beginning. There were new things to learn, I wasn't behind on any homework, and I could again vow to stay on top of my workload so I wouldn't get stressed at exam time. Bishop Ough Retirement

ishop Bruce R. Ough will retire on December 31, B 2020 after serving The United Methodist Church for 45 years.

He was ordained a deacon in 1975 and an elder in 1979 in the former North Dakota Annual Conference.



After serving in the North Dakota Conference, the Northern Indiana Conference, and the Iowa Conference, he was elected and consecrated as a Bishop in July 2000.

He served the West Ohio Area from 2000-2012 and has been resident bishop of the Dakotas-Minnesota Area since September 1, 2012.

We have been blessed by Bishop Ough's extraordinary leadership

and the support he and his wife, Char, have given to both the laity and clergy of both conferences.

Over the past eight years, under Bishop Ough's steady leadership, the Minnesota Conference launched The ELI Project, a summer internship program that places college students into host churches to explore vocational ministry firsthand; increased its clergy recruitment efforts; and developed a process to provide training, peer learning, and spiritual growth opportunities for clergy from recruitment through retirement.

He helped the Dakotas-Minnesota Area secure a \$1 million Lilly grant to address economic challenges facing pastors.

Bishop Ough has also been a leader on the Connectional Table and within the Council of Bishops and denomination as The United Methodist Church has navigated its future.

"I am the product of a mentoring culture," Bishop Ough has said. "I was not born a leader; I was raised to be a leader by others who very intentionally invested in me. By the time I responded to God's call and headed to seminary, I knew that a major portion of my ministry was to multiply myself as a leader. I have attempted to pay my leadership debt forward ever since."

Ad Council Meeting Minutes — 8-18-20

Opening

Steve Kokotovich called the meeting to order at 6:38 p.m. Due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, the Administrative Council used Zoom to virtually meet.

Secretary's Report:

Minutes of the July 28, 2020, Administrative Council were reviewed. Jan Akervik made a motion to accept the minutes as read. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.

Lay Leader's Report - Steve Kokotovich

Steve presented the updated Asbury Reopen Team Report. 64 people responded to the survey asking members if they would attend in-person church services. 56% said that they will not attend until the COVID-19 crisis is over, 44% said that they would attend and take the necessary precautions.

As a result, starting on September 13th, Asbury will be holding in-person church services for those who wish to attend. A live streaming service will be provided for those who wish to attend virtually.

Treasurer's Report – Pat Anscomb

The July monthly summary was given. Balance on Hand, 7/31/2020 is \$24,354.84.

Through the end of July, we had not paid any of our 2020 Conference Apportionments. However, this August, we have paid half of our 2020 Conference Apportionments for a total of \$11,400.50.

Staff Parish Relations Committee - Cathy Sampson

The committee is preparing for the District Superintendent's visit to Asbury this Fall.

Trustee's Report – Dale Thorpe and Nancy Wagner

Our riding lawn mower must be replaced. A new lawn mower will be purchased from Duluth Lawn and Sports for \$2099.00. The UMW Project Fund will provide \$1,500 and the balance will be paid with money available from the Memorial Fund.

Nancy Wagner and Tom Houle were at the church all day cleaning tables between voters for the Primary Election Day. They said that the voting process was organized well but that they also had to clean the church at the end of the day. It was mentioned that the Fellowship Hall carpet was very dirty after the voting event. We discussed what could be done to prevent this from happening again during the November elections.

New aprons have been purchased.

Food Shelf Update

Pood insecurity for U.S. households in July reached its highest reported level. its highest reported level since the Census Bureau started tracking the data in May, with almost 30 million Americans reporting that they had not had enough to eat at some point in the seven days through July 21.

In the Census Bureau's weekly Household Pulse Survey, roughly 23.9 million of 249 million respondents indicated that they "sometimes not had enough to eat" for the week ended July 21, while about 5.42 million indicated that they "often not had enough to eat."

The number of respondents who sometimes had insufficient food was at its highest point in the survey's 12 weeks. The number who often experienced food insufficiency was at its highest since the week ending May 26.

This follows the deep recession resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic, which has put millions of Americans out of work. Unemployed Americans had been receiving an extra \$600 per week benefit, which was set to expire at the end of July as Congress debates a new relief package.

Walk/Hike Scheduled for September 20







These healthy chips make a yummy back-to-school snack.

What you need:

- 4 apples, cored and cut into 1/8" rings
- Large bowl
- Spoon
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- Baking sheets (sprayed)

What you do:

- 1. Place apple slices in the bowl. Add cinnamon and sugar. Stir so apples are coated evenly with the mixture.
