#### **March FoodShare Campaign 2021**

Innesota FoodShare began its work in 1982 with a campaign to restock food shelves in the 7-county Twin Cities Metro Area. It was so successful and the need was so evident, the Campaign became a statewide program just one year later. During the 2020 Campaign, more than \$21.5 million dollars and over 7.4 million pounds of



food shelf items were raised by Minnesota food shelves. Minnesota FoodShare envisions a future where all Minnesotans have access to healthy food and no one struggles with food insecurity. The March Campaign addresses these issues directly and invites you to join their efforts and advocate for long-term solutions to food insecurity and poverty in our communities.

During all of March, all donations to CHUM's Emergency Food Shelf are proportionally matched by the Greater Minnesota Council of Churches. Asbury can help by contributing cash and/or food donations. Please mark your monetary donation as CHUM FoodShare on the memo line or envelope. There is a table set up in the Narthex for food donations. **We will collect through April 1**. Due to the pandemic, it may be easier this year to mail in a monetary donation. If you would like to make a food donation, please drop items off on Sunday mornings or during the week (always best to call first to confirm someone is in the office, 624-0061).



#### Ad Council Meeting Minutes — 2-16-21

#### Opening

As of 1/31/2021, we have paid none of our 2021 Conference Apportionments. We have a balance due of \$20,675.16. \$150 of our Thanksgiving and Christmas offerings was sent to TPUMMS. The balance of the remaining offering is \$630. Pat Anscomb made a motion to equally divided the \$630 between the Salvation Army Heat Share Program and CHUM. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.
