Changes To Our COVID-19 Policy

fter reviewing the best practices for congregations, the Administrative Council has made the following decisions regarding our COVID-19 Policy. All decisions will be effective as of September 11:

- We will begin having Fellowship time beginning with Rally Sunday and our 30th Anniversary Celebration on September 11.
- We will not require masks for singing in the congregation.
- We will continue to rope off pews on one side of the congregation to allow for distanced seating.
- Individual groups may choose whether or not to offer meals in the Fellowship Hall.
- Asbury Singers and Praise Team practices will begin again. Look for more info about these groups in upcoming announcements and newsletters.

As we move forward, we will continue to monitor and follow the advice of our medical community and our conference.

Finding Peace Amidst Change

elcome Fall!

As Summer winds down and we hear of schools starting back, I am reminded that changes (even good ones) can be stressful and hard. There are so many changes that happen in our lives. The seasons change, our bodies change, kids grow up and leave home, people pass away, families change, churches change, activities change.

This week I was having a hard time concentrating on my work, and so I took a break to figure out why. It turns out, I have a lot of change going on in my life right now. My eldest is going off to college and I am taking a week of time off to get him there; my other three sons are starting a new school year; the church is gearing up for fall work projects/activities and celebrating 30 years in this location; and I continue to implement new exercise and eating habits to help me be the healthiest I can be. When I look at it that way, I can say WOW! I've got a lot going on! No wonder I'm getting stuck knowing where to start.

This made me wonder if others of you are experiencing change as well. My guess is yes.

So I wanted to remind us all of tools we have to navigate change and stress in our lives.

First of all, naming the change and acknowledging that change is hard can go a long way to helping out. We can be reminded to be filled with grace for ourselves and the people around us who are probably struggling in their own ways.

Secondly, taking a step back to breathe deeply is important. There are quite a few meditation guides and apps that can help you structure some time to pause. One very simple exercise is to breathe in for 5 seconds and then out for 5 seconds. Keep breathing slowly for two minutes to reset your nervous system. If you are interested in learning



more about meditation and methods for spending time in contemplation, let me know.

Thirdly, you can call or text a friend to lift you up in prayer. I asked for prayer from several people, and I feel like their prayers are helping me manage the changes.

Fourth, remember that God and God's love for you never changes, no matter what. And in thinking about God's love for you, know that this community of faith at Asbury UMC wants to walk with you through whatever changes are coming your way. With others around you to listen and help, the journey can be less stressful if not actually easier.

So whether you are excited by the coming Fall, or nervous, I encourage you to turn to your community of faith, remember God's love for you, and keep breathing!

Some of these include, but are not limited to, developing a strategic plan for the congregation, how to lead the church through a visioning process, ideas for effective stewardship and resources for developing high-performing teams.

Pastor Katherine also worked on a Connection Project that focused on areas of need within Asbury. She surveyed members to find out how they connected with Asbury before, during, and after the height of the COVID-19 pandemic. This project was designed to help identify Asbury's strengths/challenges and define core values.

Pastor Katherine worked with a coach from the business world, who provided input and support and helped her with the Connection Project.

According to Pastor Katherine, "Through the coaching, I was able to explore different directions my project could take as well as receiving feedback on best practices for the project. It was wonderful to have someone to collaborate

with and think through the impact of various ideas. The PCL program has given me tools to use for leading Asbury UMC and developing leadership within it. It was well worth my time and effort. Even the topics I had more experience in were covered in ways that added value and insight to my work as a pastor leading a congregation."




Asbury's Memorial Garden




