The Discipline of Stewardship


ne of the basic tenets of being a disciple is the discipline of stewardship. From the very beginning of creation God asks humankind to be stewards of the earth — to watch over and care for all beings and the earth itself. In the Old Testament, we see the concept of a tithe introduced, and thus being a good steward means giving one tenth of what we produce back to God as an offering. Jesus in the New Testament doubles down on this practice by saying not just a tithe, but all that we are and all that we have belong to God, and so our whole lives become daily offerings to God.

Which brings us to our stewardship time throughout this month. We are exploring our "Building Blocks of Stewardship: Growing, Gratitude, Persistence, and Fulfillment." We find these attributes exhibited in the Gospels as the disciples ask Jesus to increase their faith. We see Jesus healing the lepers and one receiving praise for his expression of gratitude. Then the widow who would not give up is praised for persistence. Finally we turn to Paul who gives his all to the very end, fighting to the last to fulfill his commitment to Jesus.

All four blocks in our stewardship journey are important, as is remembering all of our behavior is first a response to the amazing love offered to each of us by God. No matter what we give or how much, it all flows from our response to God's love.

This month we have several opportunities to experience God's love as well as giving back as an expression of our hearts. We kick off our Stewardship season on Sunday, October 2 as we celebrate communion with Christians all over the world.

On Sunday, October 9 we will have a service of healing where we have the opportunity to be anointed with oil and lifted up in prayer as we remember the healing of the lepers and give our gratitude.



Sunday, October 16 brings us to our Praise Sunday. We celebrate in song God's love that persists for us.

Then on Sunday, October 23 we can bring forward our commitment cards to express our intentions for financial giving in the coming year.

We also look forward as always to our many projects; apple pies, donuts, UWF's Fall Pantry, drive-though meatball dinner and our renewed enjoyment of song through the Asbury Singers and the Praise Team.

Please come join us on this exciting journey as we build our stewardship and our faith!

Join Us For a Volunteer Opportunity At the Damiano Center

The Damiano Center is accepting volunteers again to help in their community kitchen! Due to COVID-19 restrictions, they are only taking two to three volunteers per shift. They have suggested the shifts be split up. The shift from 8:30 to 11:00 am will be for food preparation. The shift from 11:00 am to 1:00 pm will be for serving food.

The Outreach Team has decided to reserve any fifth Saturday of each month for Asbury UMC. This usually occurs four to five times per year. The first two dates are Saturday, October 29 and Saturday, December 31. A sign-up sheet is in the Narthex for anyone interested in helping. Volunteers must be 16 or older.

The Damiano Center is the largest emergency meal provider in Northwest Minnesota serving 16 meals per week. Volunteers are essential to help their programs continue and provide services for the community.

The August monthly summary was given. Balance on Hand, 8/31/2022 is \$3,928.81.

As of 8/31/2022 we have paid 17% of our 2022 Conference Apportionments with a balance due of \$16,025.82.

Terry Olson is working on finding a new fire inspection company. New baseboard molding has been installed in the basement bathroom. Terry is planning to replace some upstairs lights.

United Women In Faith – Jan Akervik

2,229 pasties were made last weekend. 24 were donated to the Ronald McDonald House. 360 were put aside for the Pantry.

Pies - October 5 – 7. 250 pies will be made.

Donuts October 14 – 15.

Pantry - October 15.

Drive through Meatball Dinner - October 25.

43 backpacks were collected this year and have been donated to area schools. Instead of collecting backpacks next year, we will be collecting school supplies and donating them to Operation Classroom.

The vertical blinds in the Fellowship Hall are in the process of being replaced.

Outreach and Missions Team – Steve Kokotovich sent an email report. The committee met on September 13.

The Salvation Toy Drive will happen again this year.

"Sock"tober will be held again this year. We will be collecting men's warm winter socks and gloves.

The committee is providing CPR and AED training on November 19th from 9:00 to 11:30 a.m. This will be open to the entire Asbury family and also to the public. The cost will be \$25 and will be taught by a Community Education instructor. It was suggested that Asbury would like to provide a reduced rate for members of Asbury so we will be looking for a pocket of money to pay for this rate reduction.

We hope to start working at the Damiano Center on the 5th Saturday of each month. Typically 4 times per year.

We will try promoting one food item per month for those who would like to donate to the Food Shelf.

On September 22, from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m., we will be working with members of Norton Park Methodist to do Grand Avenue clean up between 59th Avenue West to Norton Park. We will be doing this about 2 to 3 times per year. The committee discussed the outdoor concerts that UPC in Morgan Park held this year and wondered if Asbury had an interest on doing something like that.



Church-School Partnership Volunteers Needed

The United Methodist Church's Mission Promotion Team has encouraged all United Methodist Churches in Minnesota to become partners with local schools. Asbury UMC has started the process of building a team to partner with Laura MacArthur Elementary School. After the Church-School Partnership Team's informational meeting, it became apparent that we needed to clarify what partnering entails.

The partnership will involve members of our congregation whether new volunteers or those who are already volunteering at Stowe, Laura MacArthur, or Lincoln

Middle School. Volunteers who have already established themselves at the school and may be working with a specific class, teacher or students will be grandfathered into the Asbury UMC-Laura MacArthur partnership.

Individuals with time during a school week and able to volunteer are welcome and needed. The greatest need is for people to read to the students. Secondly, help with handwriting skills is needed. Spending time with the students doing puzzles or educational games would also be important.

Another option mentioned by Shane Johnson, tier One Dean of Students at Laura MacArthur, would be to adopt a classroom. This would require assisting in a classroom on special event days and providing supplies needed by the students.

Asbury UMC is not able to provide the help our local schools need without a solid team. If you are interested in learning more about the church-school partnership opportunity, please contact Alice Brenny or Pastor Katherine for details. If you are already volunteering in one of the schools mentioned above, please let Alice or Pastor Katherine know.
