#### What you need:

- 3 egg whites
- ½ tsp. vanilla extract
- Mixer
- 2 Tbsp. powdered sugar
- · 1 Tbsp, cornstarch
- · Parchment paper

### What you do:

- Preheat oven to 300°. In a mixing bowl, combine egg whites and vanilla. Whisk eggs with mixer at medium speed until frothy.
- While whisking, gradually add sugar and cornstarch. Keep whisking at high speed until stiff peaks form.
- Spoon mixture onto a baking sheet lined with parchment paper. Create fun shapes.
- Bake 20 minutes. Cool and enjoy!
