

#### **Let Love Light Our Lives**


his Sunday, thanks to the work of many hands, the Sanctuary and church building have undergone a beautiful transformation! All of the Christmas decorations are up and there is beauty everywhere as we prepare to celebrate the coming of Jesus into the world.

Each year, we choose a theme for our decorations to focus our thoughts during this time of waiting. Our theme this year is "Incarnation" which means to become flesh or to become part of this world. We celebrate God's "incarnation" as Jesus who came and made real to us God's love for us and God's creativity in creation. The stars you see around you remind us of God's desire to shine light and love in this world. God came to Earth as a baby to shine light and love.

As we journey through each week of Advent, I invite you to notice how the story of Mary and Joseph traveling to Bethlehem unfolds through the figures on the table in front of the pulpit. 





#### What you need:


- A strand of Christmas lights
