Why Do United Methodists Give Apportionments?

A pportionments are the way that congregations are connected to the conference and the world. They are used to fund the global mission and witness of our church, to help provide the necessary structure to respond in moments of crisis locally, nationally, internationally, and to develop and nurture the leaders we need today and tomorrow.

With over 12 million members working in 136 countries, The United Methodist Church's global reach is made possible through these 7 funds: World Service Fund, Episcopal Fund, Ministerial Education Fund, Black College Funds, General Administration Fund, Africa University Fund and Interdenominational Cooperation Fund.

The basic idea behind apportionments is that local congregations send some of the money they collect to accomplish things that are either beyond their ability to do as individual congregations or that can be done more effectively or efficiently together. Apportionments allow the church to produce goods and services funded by all for the benefit of all – collective goods.

Connectional Giving demonstrates our connectedness to one another, to God and to the body of Christ. The connections of the church are more than institutions; the connections are the means God uses to convey grace to the world. It is one of the founding ideas that the United Methodist Church was built upon. Participating in connectional giving helps us to be in mission with people and congregations around the world — giving every church, regardless of size, a larger mission footprint.

Apportionments allow us to do together what no church, district, or annual conference could do alone.



Scholarship Sunday will be held on Sunday, May 5, 2024. Scholarship information is listed below. Completed applications are **due by Saturday, April 20, 2024**. Applications may be downloaded from the website at www.asburyduluth.org, obtained in the church office or please submit a request at asburyumcduluth@hotmail.com.

The Carol B. Maida Memorial Scholarship is financed through the permanent Endowment Fund of the Asbury United Methodist Church. This Award is named in honor of Carol B. Maida, who was active in her Church and her Community. The purpose of the scholarship is to recognize members of Asbury who possess the qualities of Compassion, Perseverance, and Positive Attitude through support and encouragement with their

post-high school and adult education.



The Robert & Aileen VanKleek Memorial Scholarship is financed through the permanent Endowment Fund of the Asbury United Methodist Church. This Award is named in honor of Robert & Aileen VanKleek who were active members of Central Avenue and Asbury UMC. Robert was also principal at Denfeld High School. The purpose of this scholarship is to recognize the academic accomplishments and participation in the

congregational life of members of Asbury UMC through support of their post-high school and adult education.

Requirements for Eligibility

- ◆ Description of their Leadership and Participation in Community, School, Asbury UMC, and statement of future goals

Applicants may be required to have a personal interview with the Scholarship Committee.

In order to receive consideration for these scholarships, application and supporting material **MUST** be received in the church office by **April 20**, **2024**. Recipients will be announced on Scholarship Sunday on May 5, 2024.



Use scrap paper to fuel new growth and make a gift that keeps on giving.

What you need:

- Scrap paper
- Water
- Herb or flower seeds
- Blender
- Strainer
- Cookie sheet
- Towel
- · Adult help



What you do:

- Tear the scrap paper into strips and place in a bowl. Cover the paper with water and let it soak overnight.
- Pour the mixture into a blender and blend about 10 seconds.
- Strain and squeeze the paper pulp to remove excess water. Place in a bowl.
- 4. Sprinkle seeds over the pulp and mix to incorporate them into the pulp.
- Shape the pulp into a flat layer on the cookie sheet. Use a towel to soak up excess water. Allow the paper to dry completely.
- 6. Tear paper into shapes or fold into a card. You can plant the paper directly into soil. Water it and then watch your plants grow!
