Chum March Food Drive

Every March, donations to CHUM's Food Shelf are proportionally matched by the Greater Minnesota Council of Churches. CHUM will be accepting donations from February 26 – April 6 this year. To help, Asbury will be collecting food and monetary donations. Cash donations are preferred as the Food Shelf is able to stretch cash further by working with their partners to purchase more food. For every \$1 that gets donated, CHUM can buy \$3 worth of food! Please mark your monetary donations for "CHUM Foodshare" on the memo line of your check or offering envelope and drop into the collection plate or mail to the office.

A table is set up in the Narthex for food donations. Foods most needed at this time include: peanut butter, canned soups, chili, stew, beans, canned fruits and vegetables, pasta, rice, and cereal. The need for food has continued to grow and food donations have been down, so CHUM can really use our help to restock their shelves. Their goal this year is \$100,000 and 50,000 pounds of food. Thank you for your continued support.

Community Services At Asbury UMC

Last month we spotlighted two community services at Asbury UMC: In Harmony Reiki & Inner Wellness by Debbie Merrick and Living Hope Counseling & Coaching, LLC by Robin Williams. Additional community services at Asbury UMC include CPR/First Aid classes provided by Shelly Vanneste and Gentle Yoga classes provided by Cheryl Zupec. (Descriptions below.)

Asbury's Mission Statement is to be a church that serves, grows, builds, and blesses the community. Through these ministries we have an opportunity to reach more people with our hospitality.

CPR Classes, Shelly Vanneste American Heart Assn. CPR/First Aid Instructor

You'll never know when you'll need to save a life. As an American Heart Association CPR/First Aid instructor for six years I've trained many childcare providers in the ability to be prepared for real-life situations in their work environment. Now I am happy to be bringing my courses to Asbury UMC with the help of a grant from the Northland Foundation that is part of their Neighbor Child Care Project.

Starting in March, I will be offering at least one course a month through June 2024 to help certify Family, Friend, and Neighbor (FFN) providers in the Duluth Superior area. FFN providers are "informal," unlicensed childcare providers that are typically an extended family member, friend, or neighbor. I will be offering these classes at no cost to FFN providers as outlined in my grant, but **I am also opening the classes up to members of Asbury.**

If you're interested in becoming fully certified or simply learning "Hands-Only" I'd love to have you join one of the six classes, I have scheduled. Tentative dates (dependent on enrollment): Saturday, March 2, 9:00 am to 1:00 pm; Sunday, March 24, Noon to 4:00 pm; Sunday, April 21, Noon to 4:00 pm; Monday, May 13, 9:00 am to 1:00 pm; Sunday, June 2, Noon to 4:00 pm; Monday, June 24, 9:00 am to 1:00 pm. Gentle Yoga, Cheryl Zupec Yoga Instructor

There are many benefits to a regular yoga practice, ranging from increased flexibility, muscle tone and range of motion. Additionally, you can benefit from learning breath control, meditation and relaxation.

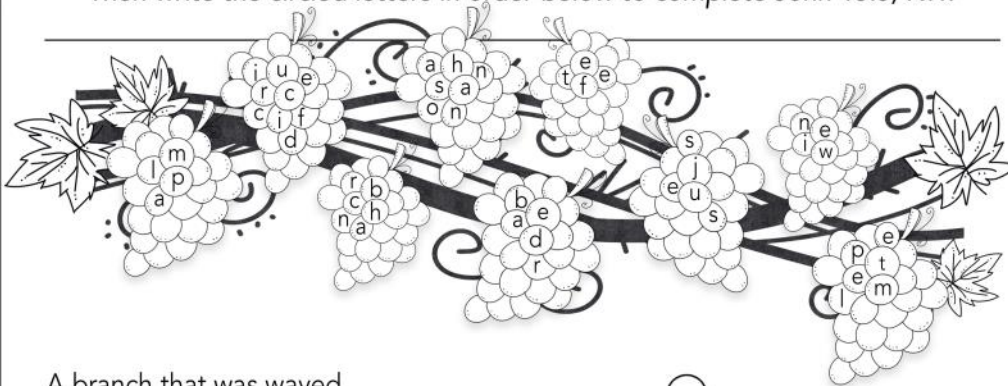

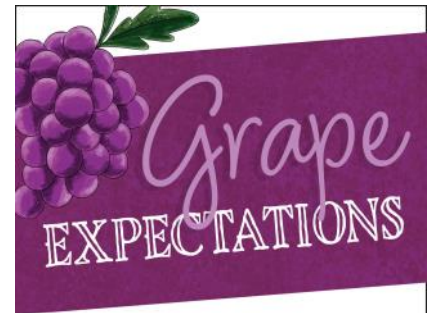

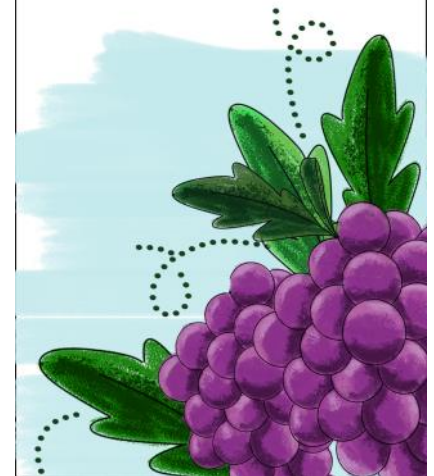
Try this chilly new take on a healthy snack.

What you need:

- 30 grapes, washed and dried
- ½ cup vanilla yogurt
- 4 graham crackers, crushed
- Toothpicks
- Parchment paper

What you do:

1. On a baking sheet lined with parchment paper, arrange grapes in a single layer. Freeze for two hours.
2. Insert a toothpick into each grape.
3. Dip each grape into the yogurt, coating half of it.
