

Pentecost power

en days after Jesus ascended into heaven, the Holy Spirit descended onto Jesus' disciples. While they were gathered in Jerusalem to celebrate the Jewish festival of Pentecost, the disciples saw flames among and on them, heard a rushing wind and began talking in many languages. As a result, the disciples were able to share the good news of Jesus in the native tongues of all the pilgrims assembled in the city.

Even today, the power of the Holy Spirit fuels the "flame" that ignites Christians' outreach efforts. Only by the Spirit's power can we know Christ and make him known throughout the world.

Poet William Blake (1757-1827), who's been described as a passionate, Pentecost kind of person, wrote this poem about the Spirit's power:

Unless the eye catch fire,
The God will not be seen.
Unless the ear catch fire,
The God will not be heard.
Unless the tongue catch fire,
The God will not be named.
Unless the heart catch fire,
The God will not be loved.
Unless the mind catch fire,
The God will not be known.

s you have heard, many exciting things are happening at Asbury UMC! We are in the middle of our Spring activities with meatballs, collecting diapers for moms and babies, distributing food to school children, and giving away scholarships. These activities, driven by our shared values and commitment, bring us joy and fulfillment. We are hoping to venture into new places with biking and Laundry Love. And, we also have irons in the fire for June events coming up!

Why are we gathering to bike together? Because we want to build our relationships and grow our health. Our vision and mission energize us to jump in and find our purpose each day.

Taking time to connect with God and one another and seeing how our bigger picture of service and love keeps us energized and engaged. Join us and see for yourselves!








In-carnation



a vase to help arrange flowers and hold stems in place. This personalized frog will become a favorite!

What you need:

- Air-dry clay
- Roller
- Vase (or jar)
- Plastic knife
- Straw
- Acrylic paint and brushes



What you do:

- Roll out a portion of clay to about ½-inch thickness.
- 2. Cut out a circle that's slightly larger than the vase opening. (This will allow the finished frog to sit securely on top.)
- To make holes for stems, use a straw to punch out circle shapes. If you make more than one frog, try arranging the holes in different patterns.
- 4. Let dry completely. Then personalize your work with acrylic paint.
- 5. When dry, place the frog atop the vase.
