Tickets are **\$15.00**. Get your tickets and bring the family and your friends! Please return all unsold tickets to Gary W. by April 21.



hese are the classic lines for celebrating Easter Sunday. We acknowledge that what we thought was final and unbeatable is now in God's hands and control. Death does not have the final say in our lives!

And the miracle of the Resurrection is that it is not just about victory over our physical death. The resurrection of Jesus invites us to live our lives today and every day, knowing nothing is impossible for God! That means our fears, doubts, inadequacies, and poor choices can be reconciled and made new in God's redeeming love. We do not need to be held captive by whatever holds us back. Instead, we can grow and change and live in the faith community around us.

This joy and freedom can be experienced in our lives individually, but it is also experienced in the ways that we gather together and live out our vision and mission in this world. We acknowledge that we are people who celebrate the diversity of our communities. We hold space for one another, honoring and valuing each person. The Twin Ports United Methodist Ministries (TPUMMs) recently sponsored a conversation with Rabbi David Steinberg. While there, a quote was mentioned from a mentor of his, Rabbi Mordecai M. Kaplan. *"We short-circuit religion when we treat it as an affair between the individual and God. To function normally, the religious current connecting the individual with God must pass through the life of a people."* — Rabbi Mordecai M. Kaplan (founder of Reconstructionist Judaism) in *Not So Random Thoughts* (Reconstructionist Press, 1966, p. 133) This quote underscores the importance of community and a group of people gathering together to live out their faith.

As we approach Easter and the life-changing miracle of the Resurrection, may we connect more fully with our congregation and, through that connection, reach out to the community of West Duluth and the world beyond with our service, love, and presence.

Learn how to face and overcome the fears we feel about loneliness, illness, financial insecurity, disappointing others, failure, insignificance, and aging. You would be hard-pressed to overstate the extent to which fear, anxiety and worry permeate our lives today. Fear wreaks havoc on our relationships and communities. It leads us into making bad decisions. It holds us back from the very pursuits that promise fulfillment and joy.

Unafraid is Reverend Adam Hamilton's insightful and impassioned response. Drawing on recent research, inspiring real-life examples, and fresh biblical insight, Hamilton uses a mixture of facts and faith to help readers understand and counter fears related to such outsize perils as death and illness, as well as the everyday anxieties all of us encounter.

Scholarship Applications Available NOW!

Scholarship Sunday will be held on Sunday, April 27, 2025. Scholarship information is listed below. Completed applications are **due by** Saturday, April 19. Applications may be downloaded from the website at www.asburyduluth.org, obtained in the church office or please submit a request at asburyumcduluth@hotmail.com.

The Carol B. Maida Memorial Scholarship is financed through the permanent Endowment Fund of the Asbury United Methodist Church. This Award is named in honor of Carol B. Maida, who was active in her Church and her Community. The purpose of the scholarship is to recognize members of Asbury who possess the qualities of Compassion, Perseverance, and Positive Attitude through support and encouragement with their



post-high school and adult education.

The Robert & Aileen VanKleek Memorial Scholarship is financed through the permanent Endowment Fund of the Asbury United Methodist Church. This Award is named in honor of Robert & Aileen VanKleek who were active members of Central Avenue and Asbury UMC. Robert was also principal at Denfeld High School. The purpose of this scholarship is to recognize the academic accomplishments and participation in the congregational life of

members of Asbury UMC through support of their post-high school and adult education.

Requirements for Eligibility

Applicants must be **Full Members** of Asbury UMC on the date of application. They must also have been a Full Member of the congregation for at least one year prior to the application deadline date. Applicants must also be enrolled or accepted into a post-high school degree or certificate program either full-time or part-time.

Selection Criteria

An application for these scholarships is available:

Applicants must complete and submit an Application Form along with supporting material, which must include:

- Final or most recent official high school transcript
- Evidence of enrollment or acceptance into a post-high school degree or certificate program
- Most recent transcript of grade report form if already in a post-high school program
- Description of their Leadership and Participation in Community, School, Asbury UMC, and statement of future goals

Applicants may be required to have a personal interview with the Scholarship Committee.

Application Deadline

In order to receive consideration for these scholarships, application and supporting material **MUST** be received in the church office by **April 19, 2025**. Recipients will be announced on Scholarship Sunday on April 27, 2025.

Camp Minnesota has let Asbury UMC know that a camp scholarship is available for summer camp. As part of their legacy, Lester Park UMC (closed in 2018) established a fund through the Minnesota UM Foundation to help send area youth to summer camp. The fund provides up to four \$200 camp scholarships per year and will be given to campers who meet ALL of the following requirements:




