What Makes Your Heart Sing?

his is a question I've pondered. The Lilly Foundation asks this question of all pastors applying for a Clergy Renewal Leave. The stated purpose of the program offers: "The Lilly Endowment National Clergy Renewal Program at Christian Theological Seminary (CTS) seeks to strengthen Christian congregations by providing opportunities for their pastors to step away briefly from the demands of daily parish life and engage in a period of renewal and reflection. We recognize that clergy take on a variety of pastoral roles within their congregations: preacher, teacher, spiritual guide, counselor, friend, confidant. The demands of ministry can feel relentless. Keeping pace with these demands can be tiring. Drawing on practices of sabbath rest, we recognize that pastors occasionally need time to replenish their spiritual reservoirs and regain energy and strength for their calling. Sabbath rest includes time for pastors to renew themselves physically, emotionally, relationally and spiritually."

Throughout the Bible, God commands humans to take regular times of rest and renewal. In the Ten Commandments, we see the importance of weekly renewal in a day of rest. In Leviticus 25, God commanded the Israelites to observe a "sabbatical year" every seventh year. It would be a year without sowing, harvesting or pruning. It would be a year when even the land would be given sabbath, which farming has since learned is an excellent agricultural practice. Our denomination and conference ask pastors to take a sabbath every seven years for renewal and to fight against burnout. This is also excellent practice. In 2026, I approach seven years as your pastor. I hope to mark the time with an extended leave made possible by the Lilly Foundation Clergy Renewal Program so that I might continue to produce "good fruit."

Let us return to the original question: What makes your heart sing? For Asbury, relationships are central to who we are as a congregation. Time after time, the comments of those encountering Asbury reflect our warm and welcoming atmosphere. It is relationships forged through work projects and service opportunities, worship, fellowship, and small group gatherings at the heart of Asbury UMC. Our mission statement says Asbury UMC is an active, welcoming congregation that exists to serve, grow, build, and bless our congregation, community and the world. We have an excellent foundation and are now called to expand on that foundation.

My heart sings when I get to nurture relationships with God, with family, with friends, and with you the congregation. In 2026, several significant milestones will be happening in my family. My oldest child will graduate from college in China, and my youngest will graduate from high school. An extended sabbath time would allow me to focus on these momentous occasions. I will also have time for a week of spiritual renewal and time with friends and extended family.

While I am away nurturing relationships, you will continue celebrating the relationships already here and we both can dream of places where we could create depth and breadth of relationships in our congregation, community and the world. God is the God of relationships and community. We see God's purpose in drawing all of creation back to Godself through renewing and restoring relationships. As we come back together after renewal leave, we can highlight and celebrate our time together as we reach out with renewed interest to our community.

Part of the process of receiving a Lilly Foundation Grant requires the encouragement and support of the congregation. There will be a congregational meeting after church on February 16 in which I will speak more fully about the possibilities for my renewal leave and the plans for congregational and pastoral care while I am away. I hope that you will stay after church and that you can joyfully encourage me in this opportunity for renewal and exploration of what makes our hearts sing!



California Wildfires — **Ways to Help** Major wildfires in and around Los Angeles, CA have together burned nearly 40,000 acres since the first one ignited January 7. The fires have killed at least 24 people, destroyed more than 12,000 structures — including multiple United Methodist churches, and overwhelmed responders.

Bishop Lanette Plambeck urges Minnesota United Methodists to offer help and hope to those feeling the impact of this disaster by praying for those affected and for the firefighters who are responding, and to give to relief efforts. There are several options to consider:

- Donate to the Los Angeles Recovery Fund created by the California-Pacific Conference of the United Methodist Church. Funds will go toward relief efforts. Please send a check to: California-Pacific Conference, Los Angeles Fires Recovery Fund, P.O. Box 6006, Pasadena, CA 91102-6006.
- Donate to the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) U.S. Disaster Response and Recovery. UMCOR has awarded two solidarity grants to the California-Pacific Annual Conference to support immediate relief efforts. This includes evacuee support like food and essential supplies, as well as support for volunteer efforts and other relief activities.

This program consists of regular opportunities to come alongside people who are struggling financially by assisting them with their laundry. The Laundry Love program partners with groups and local laundromats in cleaning clothes and linens for low-income or no-income families and person(s).

Spin City Laundry at 232 North Central Ave., Duluth, is open Tuesday mornings as a time to set aside for Laundry Love. Asbury volunteers will team up with staff at Spin City for each Laundry Love session. The dates allotted to Asbury for the 5th Tuesdays in 2025 are: April 29, July 29, September 30 and December 30. Volunteers will arrive around 8:00 am or a little after, bring snacks for the patrons if you want and usually finish around 12:30 pm or so. Everyone is welcome to volunteer! A sign-up sheet will be in the Narthex. Attendees at the Advent Tea collected \$1,000 in a freewill offering for Laundry Love and an additional freewill offering in the amount of \$111 was collected at the Community Thanksgiving Service on Tuesday, November 26 for a total \$1,111.

Opening

Secretary's Report

Minutes of the November 21, 2024, Administrative Council were reviewed. Barb Kokotovich made a motion to accept the minutes as read. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.

Lay Leader's Report - Steve Kokotovich

Steve will be out of town for this year's Annual Conference, June 11-13. He is looking for someone else to go in his place for all or part of the conference. At the November Ad. Council meeting we discussed if the church is taking on too many projects. Steve encouraged members to go back to their committees and discuss this matter.

Two motions were made tonight from the results of the discussion: Steve Kokotovich made a motion that at the February Ad Council meeting the Council will approve that the Fall meatball dinner be eliminated and part of the pasty money be transferred to apportionments to make up for the lost revenue from the Meatball dinner. Bev LeClair made a motion that at the February Ad Council meeting, the Council shall approve revising the rummage sale to sell only books, music, DVDs, puzzles and games. 


