# A Penny For Your Thoughts

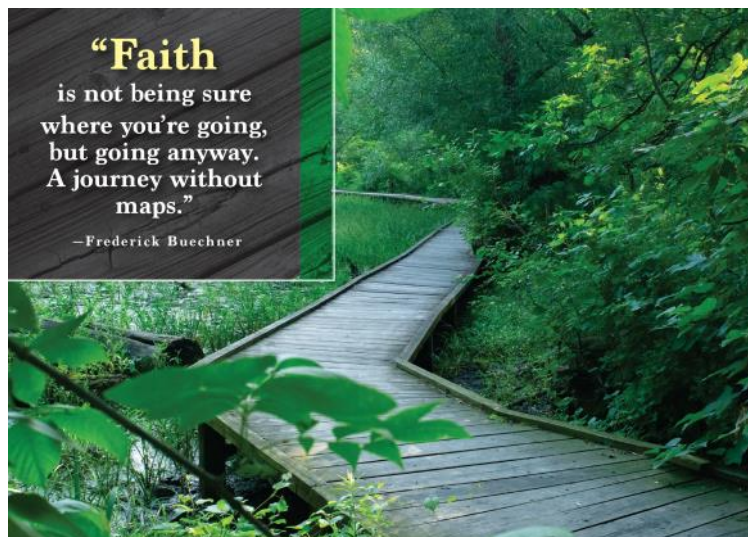
## Journeying Together in 2025

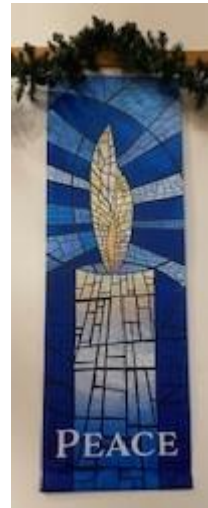
## Beautiful Decor

Thank you to Dawn Parendo for sharing her beautiful photography with us for Advent/Christmas. Her photo boards were displayed at the front of the Sanctuary. Below, please read her reflections on her photos representing Hope, Joy, Peace and Love.

## Hope – The Rainbow

The rainbow is a symbol of hope because it appears after storms and represents the promise of better times after a period of darkness. In the bible, a rainbow is seen as a sign from God to Noah that the great flood is over. Genesis 9:12-15 “I have set my rainbow in the clouds, and it will be the sign of the covenant between me and the earth. Whenever I bring clouds over the earth and the rainbow appears in the clouds, I will remember my covenant between me and you and all living creatures of every kind.” It represents God’s promise to humankind to remind us to be hopeful for the future. It is a symbol of renewal and a better life.

This is my “once in a lifetime” shot. I was sitting on the rocks below the lighthouse when I got caught in the rain. I wasn’t happy about getting rained on, but I remember thinking, “Rain plus sun = rainbows.” I was looking in the opposite direction of the lighthouse at the pebble beach and when I turned around, I witnessed this magnificent full rainbow through Split Rock lighthouse, itself a symbol of light in the darkness guiding our path. It was a magical, God-filled moment for me.

## Joy – Trees

Some of the passages in the bible that refer to trees include Psalm 96:12 “Let all the trees of the forest sing for Joy,” Isaiah 55:12 “You will go out in joy and be led forth in peace; the mountains and hills will burst into song before you, and all the trees of the field will clap their hands,” and 1 Chronicles 16:33 “Let the trees of the forest sing, let them sing for joy before the Lord, for he comes to judge the earth. Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever.”

This photo was taken at the Cloquet Forestry Center. The trees here date back to the 1820s. They didn’t burn in the 1918 fires, although there is evidence of fire at the base of many of them. As years go by, the trees heal themselves, growing fresh wood and the fire scars get smaller. Seeing this beautiful field of asters and the autumn colors bursting around these towering trees that survived these fires many years ago filled me with joy and reminded me of nature’s ability to heal and regenerate itself.

## Peace Like a River

The idea of peace like a river is that God’s peace is constant like a river that is always flowing. Even as water

encounters boulders and rocks, it continues to flow around them. God’s peace can quiet our souls even when the world around us is raging. Isaiah 66:12, “Behold, I will extend peace to her like a river, and the glory of the Gentiles like a flowing stream.”

This photo was taken at Kingsbury Creek. The trail here follows a series of waterfalls and pools that start at the top of the hill and work their way down through the zoo. I frequently struggle with anxiety, and sitting by a stream and listening to the sound of the bubbling water always carries my anxieties away and fills me with a profound sense of peace.

## Love – Rays of Light

In the Bible, God is described as both light and love. The rays of light shining down through the darkness in this photo, symbolize God’s love radiating out to illuminate our path. No matter how dark life may feel, Christ’s light can be a beacon for us. 1 John 1:5, 4:16 “God is light, and in him is no darkness at all.” “God is love; and he that dwelleth in love dwelleth in God, and God in him.” John 8:12 “I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life.”

This photo was taken at the Two Harbors breakwater. I was mesmerized by this beautiful light piercing the darkness and I was reminded of God’s love for us. I could have sat there all day watching God’s glory.

This project was difficult for me as I have thousands of pictures to choose from and several of my pictures evoked multiple feelings for me. When I asked some of my family and friends for their advice, everyone had a different opinion. I hope that in some way, these photos inspired you to think about what your visions of Hope, Joy, Peace and Love are.

For me, being in nature is to be in God’s presence. Several years ago, Jan Evans, a member of Asbury who has passed away, sent me a note saying that the following quote reminded her of me and that my photos helped her to see God’s beauty all around us:

*“Never lose an opportunity of seeing anything that is beautiful; for beauty is God’s handwriting – a wayside sacrament. Welcome it in every fair face, in every fair sky, in every fair flower, and thank God for it as a cup of blessing.”*

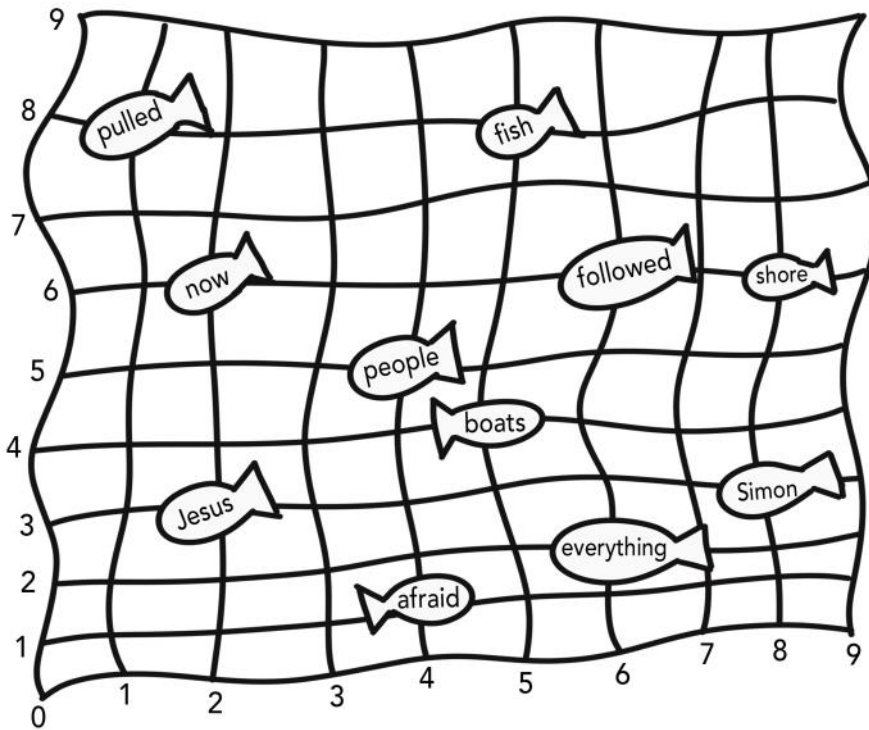

### What you need:

- Cardboard egg carton
- Acrylic paint
- Paintbrush
- Darning needle
- Fishing twine
- Scissors
- Googly eyes or buttons
- Glue



### What you do:

1. From the egg carton, cut out the 12 cups. From the lid, cut out two fish tails.
2. On a protected surface, turn the cups upside down. Paint the outside of each cup and both sides of the tails. Let dry.
3. Thread the needle with an arm's length of twine. Tie a knot at the end.
4. Thread the needle through the end of the tail. Tie another knot an inch from the tail.
5. Thread the needle through one upside-down cup. Pull the twine through until the cup rests on the knot.
6. Continue tying knots an inch above each cup and threading on another cup until you've strung six cups. Tie a knot above the last cup and leave a long string to hang the fish. (You can make two fish with each egg carton.)
7. Add googly eyes or buttons to the last cup to make a face.
