ifty days after the Resurrection, a number of people who believed that Jesus was the long -awaited Christ gathered in a Jerusalem home. Suddenly, a sound like a violent wind filled the house and something like tongues of fire rested on each person. They became filled with the Holy Spirit and their faces glowed with holiness. They began to utter other languages that the Spirit had given them the sudden ability to speak. It was an uncanny occurrence, one which the church recalls with



awe and appreciation every Pentecost.

In a way, the unique and powerful experience was the birthday of the church. So many people were filled with the Spirit that their enthusiasm and charisma influenced a large number of other people to become Christians that very day.

On that day how many people "devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship?" A. 2,000; B. 3,000; C. 4,000; D. 5,000. The answer can be found in Acts 2:41.

Use Charles Wesley's hymn "O Thou Who Camest From Above" as a prayer that the Holy Spirit will burn brightly in your heart and life today:

> O Thou who camest from above, the pure celestial fire to impart, kindle a flame of sacred love upon the mean altar of my heart.

There let it for thy glory burn with inextinguishable blaze, and trembling to its source return in humble prayer and fervent praise.

Jesus, confirm my heart's desire to work and speak and think for Thee; still let me guard the holy fire, and still stir up thy gift in me.

Please wear red on Pentecost Sunday, June 8.

or most people, birthdays are wonderful celebrations. I recall an enjoyable birthday party I had when I was young, featuring a cake in the shape of a horse's head and a trip on an indoor Ferris wheel. It was a magical time.

Birthdays are also times when we take stock and see where we are. Often, as people age, they look back on their lives and remember the highlights, or perhaps look forward to upcoming events. Birthdays can also be a time for starting anew, gaining new insight, courage, and determination for the year ahead.

Recently, I attended the 100th birthday celebration of my home church, Peachtree Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). It was a wonderful celebration of where they had been, but also a time to look ahead to the ministry that will continue in the heart of Atlanta, GA.

our donut sales, our Book Sale PLUS (a new twist on our rummage sale), and we will be hosting the Rhubarb Festival with CHUM (see page 7 of this issue).

My hope is that this Pentecost birthday and each day following will be a building of excitement and enthusiasm for our own approaching celebration of 35 years on Grand Avenue, sharing the Good News of Jesus in our community. Thanks be to God.



CHUM Rhubarb Festival — June 28

Por the first time ever, CHUM's beloved Rhubarb Festival is coming to Asbury UMC, 6822 Grand Ave. on Saturday, June 28 from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm across the Asbury UMC grounds and surrounding neighborhood.

This joyful celebration of creativity, generosity, and community is a family-friendly event featuring rhubarb pies and baked goods, a café, live music, kids' games, contests, and community fun. Admission is free, and all are welcome.

A New Home, A Familiar Spirit

The move to Asbury UMC reflects not only a change in venue, but a powerful collaboration between CHUM and the Asbury UMC congregation.

Asbury has long been known for its heart for service, and hosting the Rhubarb Festival is a natural extension of that spirit. The church grounds will be transformed into a bustling village of pie bakers, artists, musicians, kids' games, food vendors, and community organizations — all rallying to support CHUM's vital work with people experiencing homelessness and food insecurity in Duluth.

What to Expect

If you've never been to the Rhubarb Festival, you're in for a treat — literally! Festival-goers can purchase fresh rhubarb pies, crisps, jams, and sauces. There's a full rhubarb café with hot meals, rhubarb lemonade, and coffee for sale, plus live music all day, a scavenger hunt for kids, crafts, contests, a raffle, and the ever-popular pie eating competition.

This year's entertainment lineup includes a cooking demonstration, family games, local performers, and a rhubarb recipe contest that promises to be both delicious and fiercely competitive. Children can enjoy yard games, a rhubarb relay race, and a community-wide art project organized by the Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd.

Rooted in Purpose

Behind the fun lies a deeper mission. The Rhubarb

Festival is one of CHUM's largest fundraisers, with all proceeds supporting its emergency shelter, street outreach, food shelf, and advocacy programs. Last year's event helped raise tens of thousands of dollars — a testament to what's possible when the community comes together around a common purpose.

Volunteers Still Welcome

Many hands make rhubarb work! Whether you can serve pie, help with setup, greet guests, or take down tents, your time and energy make a difference. Where Do I Park?

We kindly ask that guests with limited mobility or special accessibility needs park at: Bethany Community Church, 6700 Grand Avenue. From Bethany, you can enter through the secondary festival entrance off of 67th Avenue W.

All other guests are encouraged to park at: Spirit Mountain Bike Park and Trailhead, 8551 Grand Avenue. A free shuttle to the festival grounds will run regularly from the trailhead, starting at 9:30 am, and ending at 3:30 pm. The shuttle will drop passengers off at the main festival entrance off of Grand Avenue.


Thank You, Asbury
