honestly reflect on our lives in preparation for the renewal and the resurrection of Easter.





#### Giving Up, Adding On, What's a Body To Do?

Recently, I saw a series of pictures on social media helping me gain perspective on my life and place in the vast universe. The first was a picture of the Sun, about the size of a jar lid, with the earth beside it the size of a pea. The second was a picture of the Stephenson 2-18, a red supergiant the size of a jar lid with the Sun the size of a speck. Finally, there was a picture of a black hole the size of the jar lid, and the Stephenson 2-18 red supergiant was barely visible. It reminds me of what we will be about during Lent's time. Let me explain.

Traditionally, Lent is a time in the church year when we look at our own lives and remember our mortality and, in contrast, the vast nature of God. We begin with Ash Wednesday and then have 40 days (not counting Sundays) to sit with ourselves and reconnect with God, putting our lives in perspective and asking God, what's next?

I have seen two strategies for concentrating on our connection to God during Lent. The first is to give something up. When one gives something up for Lent, the desire for that something becomes an opportunity to pause and remember God's involvement in our lives. Say a prayer or remember those whom God cares for who are less fortunate than us. Whenever I want that piece of chocolate or candy, I can instead take a breath and connect with God.

Another option is to take something on for Lent. Instead of concentrating on giving up, one adds a time of meditation, a devotional reading,



a journaling option, or perhaps a time of learning or service to our lives to reorient ourselves to who we are and who God is in our lives.

At Asbury this month, you can join together with us and the MN Conference in the Lenten Book Study, pick up a Lenten Devotional to read, decide to sit at a different table during fellowship time and get to know some new people, join with the Praise Team or the Asbury Singers, serve at the Damiano Center, bring food for CHUM, or . . . the list goes on.

No matter what you decide is right for you, I encourage you to enter into this time with intention and purpose. Take a moment to determine how you want to remember your amazing and unique place in the universe again. Also, recognize the vastness of God's creation and how wonderful it is that the God who created black holes cares for you with deep and abiding love.

Join Bishop Lanette Plambeck and the Minnesota Conference Appointive Cabinets in a Lenten study around the book *The Third Day*, by Bishop Tom Berlin. 


#### What you need:

- 1 cup rolled oats
- ½ cup nut butter (divided)
- ½ cup chocolate chips
- Microwave-safe bowl
- Silicone mini baking cups

#### What you do:

- 1. Combine the oats and ½ cup of the nut butter. Mix until oats stick together.
- 2. Place 2 teaspoons of oat mixture in each baking cup. Press with a spoon. Freeze for 10 minutes.
- 3. Spread remaining nut butter atop the cups. Freeze for 10 more minutes.
- Microwave the chocolate chips 30 seconds. Stir and keep heating for 30-second intervals until melted.
- 5. Spread melted chocolate atop the cups. Freeze until chocolate is firm.
- 6. Remove from the molds and enjoy! Refrigerate leftovers in an airtight container.

As our Faith Circle gathered together for a holiday potluck, we started talking about all the good food that was brought to share. And so it began . . . a cookbook is in the works — the *Asbury Cookbook*.
