
All Saint's Day Service of Remembrance

Hurricane Relief Fundraiser

A sbury has set up a fundraiser to help Henson Chapel in Vilas, NC where Pastor Katherine served from 2010 to 2017. The church was hit hard by Hurricane Helene. The church's basement bathrooms, Fellowship Hall and

kitchen were flooded and filled with mud.

Due to damaged roadways and bridges, many members were isolated and unable to reach the church. Some are elderly and/or have physical challenges that render them incapable of helping with the clean-up.

The church is the service and storage location for Western Watauga Food Outreach, which provides food bags once per week, as well as serving 3,500-4,000 hot meals for the community each year.

Henson Chapel will need to rely on outside restoration services, including mold and mildew prevention, which will be costly. The kitchen, bathrooms and Fellowship Hall need to be in working order quickly to be able

to continue serving the needs of the community.

If you would like to help, there is a table set up in the Fellowship Hall to donate. We will be collecting through Thanksgiving. Please make your checks out to AUMC and put Henson Chapel in the memo line.

through the eyes of a Whitmanesque ox and a visionary donkey, starry-eyed shepherds and Zen-like wise men, each of them providing a unique perspective on a scene that is, in Western culture, the central symbol for good tidings of great joy. Mitchell imagines Mary and Joseph experiencing the angelic message as a young Jewish woman and man living in the year 4 BCE might have experienced it, with terror, dismay, and ultimate

acceptance. In this context, their yes becomes an act of great moral courage. Readers of every background will be enchanted by this startlingly beautiful reimagining of the Christmas tale.

Outreach and Missions Team – Sandy W. for Steve Kokotovich "Sock" tober is in progress. A basket is set up in the Narthex to collect sock donations.




