Neither of these statements would be true without your commitment to **Earn. Save. Give.**

Your giving provides so much to the outreach in our community: the work that lovingly goes into each project done throughout the year, the bills getting paid on time, the thought-provoking sermons we are blessed with each week, the smile that can brighten someone's day – and the list could go on and on. Our individual contributions may seem small, but every one of them counts! As you will see when reviewing the information on our income and expenses for 2024 in the mailing that went out on September 30, we as a church have shown much generosity in our giving to support the many programs of Asbury. This year we are learning about **Wesley's Simple Rules For Money: Earn. Save. Give.** to guide our thoughts as we set our stewardship intentions.




